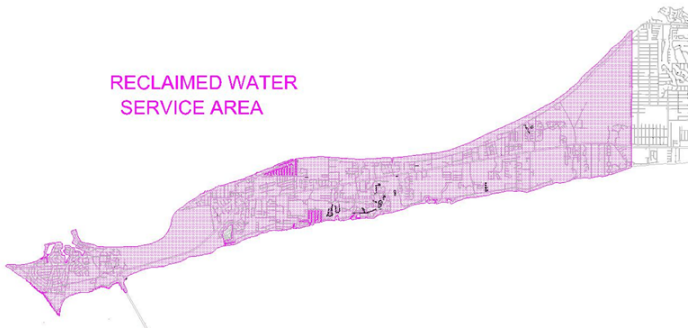
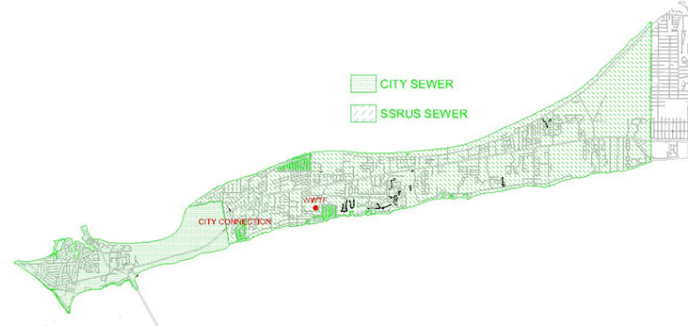
Program Description

The City of Gulf Breeze STEP has reviewed, categorized and prioritized a total of 12 locations for septic abatement. This project aims to connect a total of 395 unsewered parcels along four of the identified locations including: San Carlos (70), Gilmore (32), Warwick (161), and Poinciana (132). This drainage basin is prone to flooding and is a concern for on-site disposal systems.

Need: These areas have been targeted for septic abatement more than a decade ago. The west basin discharges into Gilmore and Hoffman Bayous, which in turn discharge into the Pensacola Bay and Santa Rosa Sound. This basin has low elevation and requires upgrades to the conveyance system which will benefit the phased schedule for septic abatement of other areas. The ecological impact of this situation is a concern for the Santa Rosa Sound. Additionally, this area has been identified as in need of economic revitalization. Historically, septic abatement has attracted new homeowners and a reinvestment of private dollars in the area. An example of such impact is the proximal abatement of 40 septic tanks on York Street.

Objective: The purpose of this program is to improve water quality by reducing the risk of septic pollutants migrating to waterways.

Proposed Allocation: \$3, 571,000
