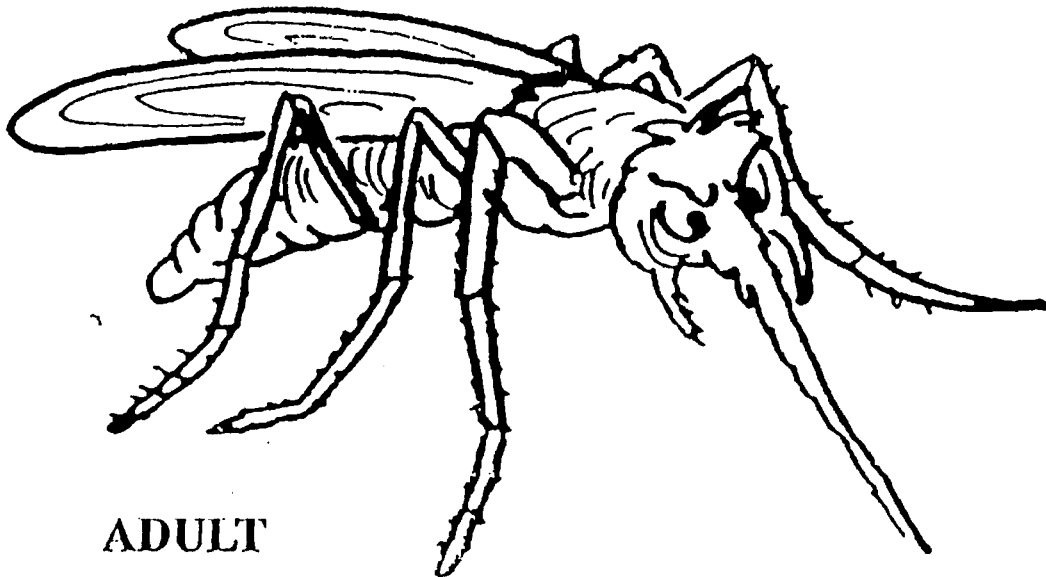
MOSQUITO

**MOSQUITOES BITE PEOPLE, BIRDS AND
ANIMALS TO OBTAIN BLOOD. THEY
NEED BLOOD SO THEIR EGGS CAN GROW.**



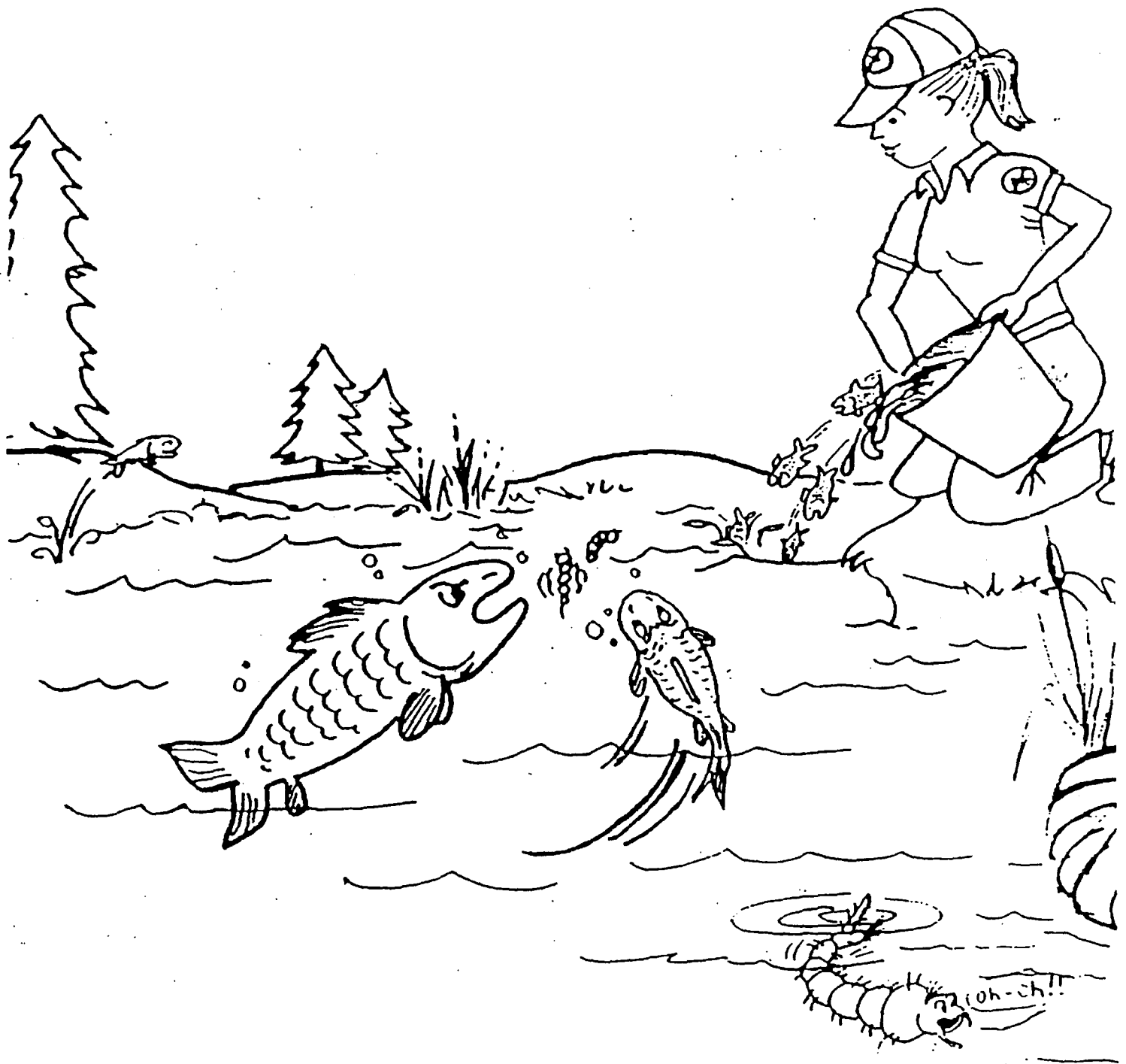
**BESIDES CAUSING AN ITCH, PEOPLE CAN BECOME
VERY SICK FROM DISEASES WHICH MOSQUITOES CARR**



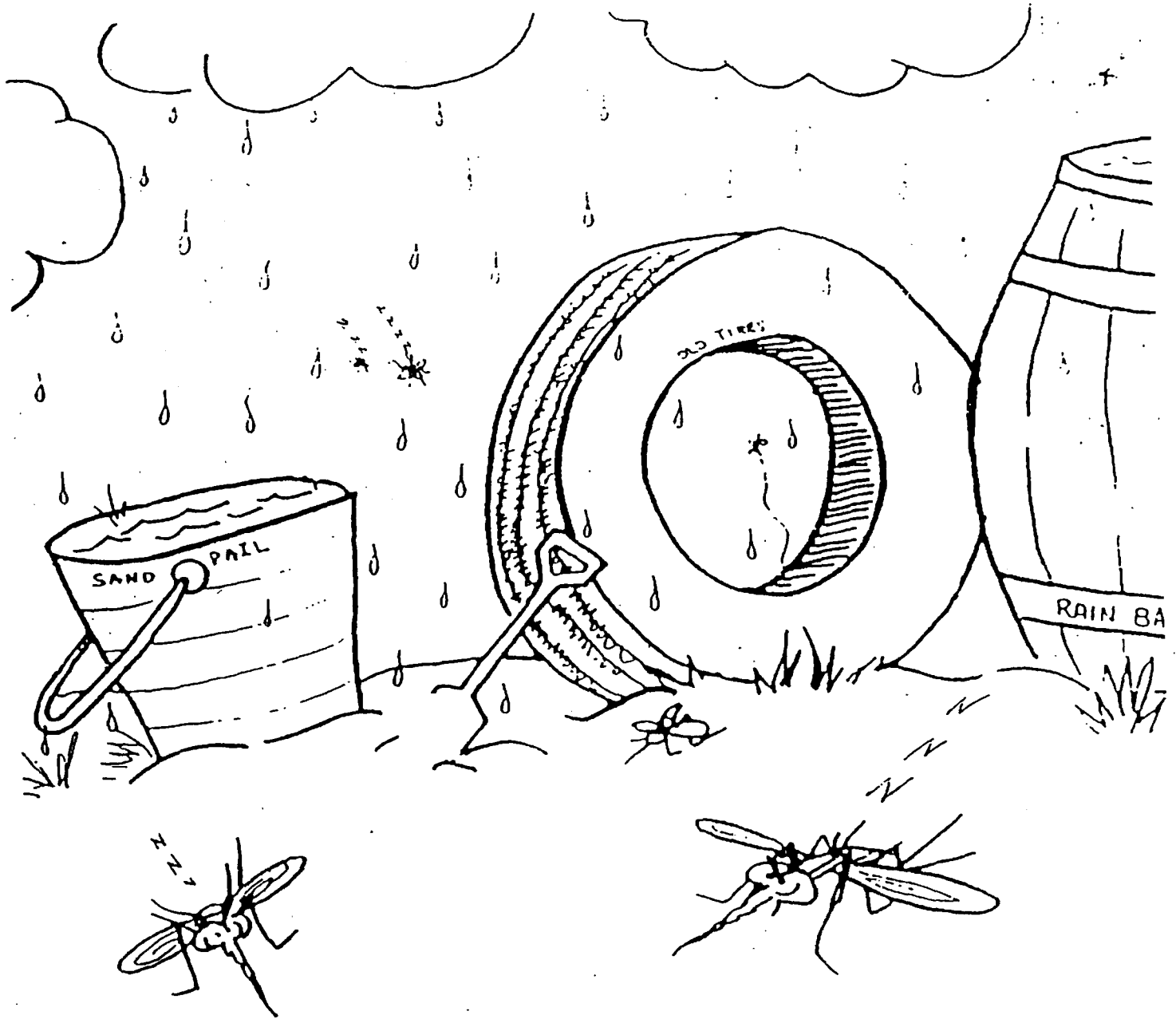
**TO KEEP PEOPLE AND ANIMALS FROM GETTING SICK,
MOSQUITOES NEED TO BE CONTROLLED**



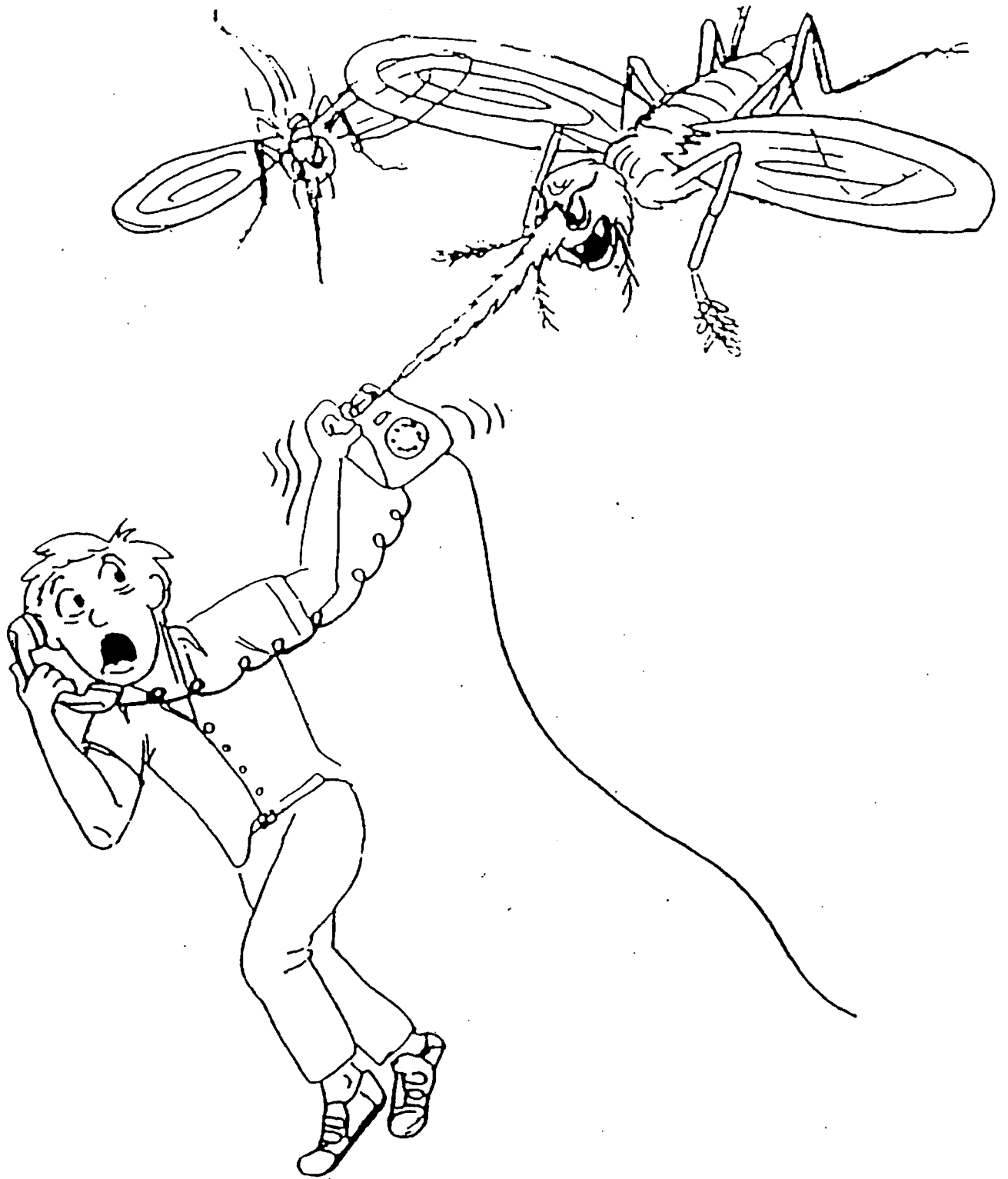
**MOSQUITO BITES CAN ALSO MAKE YOUR DOG SICK!
THEY CARRY DOG HEARTWORM DISEASE**



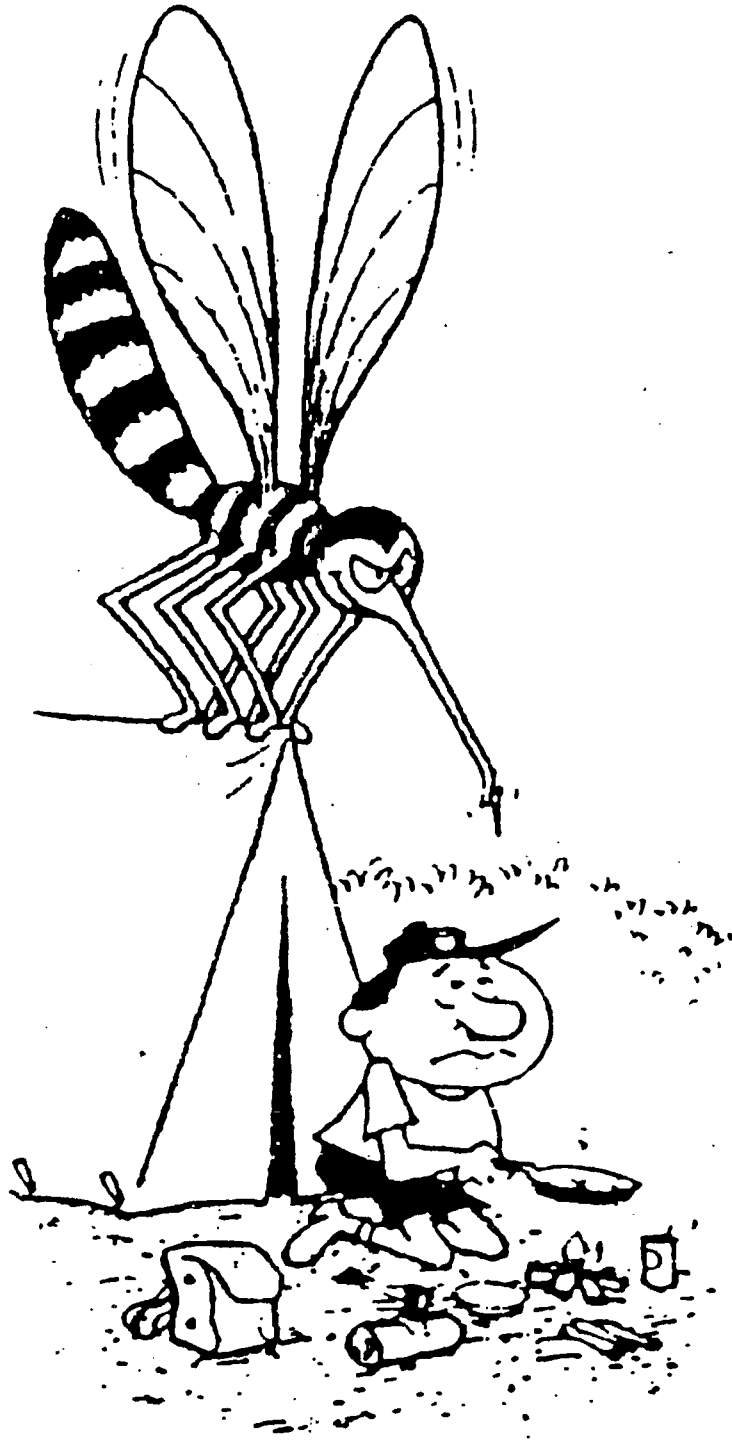
**FISH AND FROGS HELP TO CONTROL MOSQUITOES.

IN FARM AND ORNAMENTAL PONDS.**



**MOSQUITOES NEED WATER TO HATCH AND GROW. BE SURE TO
EMPTY WADING POOLS AND TOYS AFTER IT RAINS. ASK YOUR
MOM AND DAD TO CHECK FOR ANY LOW SPOTS OR OBJECTS IN
YOUR YARD THAT CAN HOLD WATER, AND GET RID OF THEM.

TEN COMMANDMENTS OF MOSQUITO CONTROL



1. Eliminate all standing water.



2. Flatten all tin cans or puncture both ends.

3. Completely seal cesspools and screen all vents.



4. Clean regularly clogged roof gutters and drain flat roofs, so no water stays.



5. Cover all standing receptacles, such as rain barrels in rural areas with netting.



6. Empty and refill outdoor birdbaths daily.



7. Stock garden pools with goldfish.



8. Tilt wheelbarrows and machines with containers to prevent holding water.



9. Empty watering can and pools after using.



10. Dispose of old tires, or anything that holds water.
