**Termination of Declaration of
State of Local Emergency**

[Tropical Storm Fred]

WHEREAS, on August 15, 2021, Santa Rosa County, issued its Declaration of State of Local Emergency pursuant to authority set forth in Chapter 125 and Section 252, Florida Statutes, and any other provision of law or county ordinance; and

WHEREAS, Tropical Storm Fred threatened the safety and welfare of the residents of Santa Rosa County and had the potential for causing extensive damage to property, public buildings, public utilities, public streets and roads and public drainage systems and is an emergency pursuant to Section 252, Florida Statutes at the time the Declaration; and

WHEREAS, as of August 16, 2021, Tropical Storm Fred has moved east of Santa Rosa County and no longer poses a direct threat to the safety and welfare of the residents of Santa Rosa County; and

WHEREAS, the Declaration of State of Local Emergency is effective for seven days following the declaration issued by the County unless terminated earlier.

NOW THEREFORE, the County Administrator on behalf of the Board of County Commissioners of Santa Rosa County, Florida, does hereby terminate the Local State of Emergency, effective August 17, 2021.

This Resolution shall be transmitted to the Secretary of State upon adoption.
