The application deadline for the Defense Infrastructure Grant (DIG) and Defense Reinvestment Grant (DRG) cycles is July 25, 2014. We are currently preparing the following applications:

Joint Land Use Plan Acquisition Funding – DIG
Request \$200,000

This project continues to implement the acquisition of properties and the development rights of properties as recommended by the previously FDA funded Joint Land Use Plan (DIG00-02). Fee simple acquisition and acquisition of development rights are two of the strategies (among others such as zoning reclassification) designated by Santa Rosa County to avoid incompatible development, prevent encroachment on the military mission, and allow for future use as deemed appropriate.

Military Consultant Funding – DRG

Note: Grant period will run from November 13, 2014 – June 30, 2015

Request \$73,630

Requests funds for a consultant to represent Santa Rosa County in activities concerning DoD, Dept of the Navy, Dept of the Air Force and other armed forces. Provides support for events and functions that reinforce positive relations between the community and the defense facility. Also includes request for funds in the amount of \$35,000 to research, develop and update a 2003 Technical Skills Inventory for Military Spouses in partnership with Haas Center.

SUBJECT: Tourist Development Council Staff/Budget

Find attached proposed revised budget for the Tourist Development Council which reflects inclusion of the three (3) current employees as county employees as opposed to the current arrangement through Landrum Staffing in partnership with Navarre Beach Area Chamber of Commerce.

The Human Resources Department had developed a comparison of the cost of including the three (3) current positions as county employees with the current cost through Landrum Staffing and it also is included. The worst case of cost differential from Landrum to county is range of \$17,380 (w/o insurance) and \$35,008 (w/insurance and fully computing leave time).

In discussing the matter with the Tourist Development Council a number of months ago, they recommended placement within and Economic Development Office which seems logical. The staff would be housed at the Visitors Information Center and nothing else will change other than accountability to the Economic Development Director.

After the recruitment, I believe the changeover will be seamless to the advisory Tourist Development Council. The TDC will continue to recommend use and programming of tourist development tax proceeds and the Director will implement those programs and uses as approved by the Board of Commissioners.

As I have noted previously, it is more difficult to determine the proper role of the TDC during the recruitment phase. The TDC has requested that it conduct the screening and selection of the Director position which concerns me in that the County Administrator retains the responsibility for the position without input into selection.

There are a couple of ways to include the TDC in this process. A method that I have found effective is the use of an interview committee which would review the applications; decide which of the most qualified applicants to interview; and interview the candidates and make selection with the County Administrator negotiating contract with the candidate chosen. This committee could include the County Administrator, Economic Development Director and the TDC Chair or his/her designee.

At any rate, I think there will be a number of qualified candidates from which to choose and however it is structured the county will continue to do well.

These projects are designed to enhance the awareness of outdoor activities and educational programs offered by the Navarre Beach Sea Turtle Conservation Center (NBSTCC) and Navarre Chamber Foundation's Navarre Beach Marine Sanctuary (NBMS). Although both projects have been in existence for less than two years, the interest in the NBSTCC and NBMS artificial reef system has been beyond expectations. Any day of the week, during a visit to the reef site, you will see snorkelers, divers, kayakers, swimmers, and paddle boarders out on the reefs viewing marine life from above and below the water. The Partners request the Santa Rosa County Commission to review the attached survey showing the area leased for the development of PPAC.

~~More than 60% of the leased area does not meet state and local development requirements. This has posed a serious problem in PPAC developing a profit-making venture for its investors.~~

Currently, the investors have split the flight training school to operate 9 aircraft in Gulf Shores, Alabama. This cost the County the economic impact of eight full-time employees.

PPAC needs ramp space to park and operate the current fleet of 20-plus aircraft now in service at the Florida and Alabama locations. Future projections estimate that 30 to 40 aircraft will be needed for flight training and rental within 18 to 24 months.

The flight school will require additional space for classrooms and offices for managerial staff.

Lifeguard Air Ambulance has contacted and is in negotiations with us to stage emergency aircraft at our facility on a 24/7 schedule. This will require employees as well as PPAC providing maintenance and fuel.

~~We respectfully ask the County Commission to review the attached references and amend our lease to include the +/- 6 acres that can be developed to meet our projected expansion over the next 60 months.~~

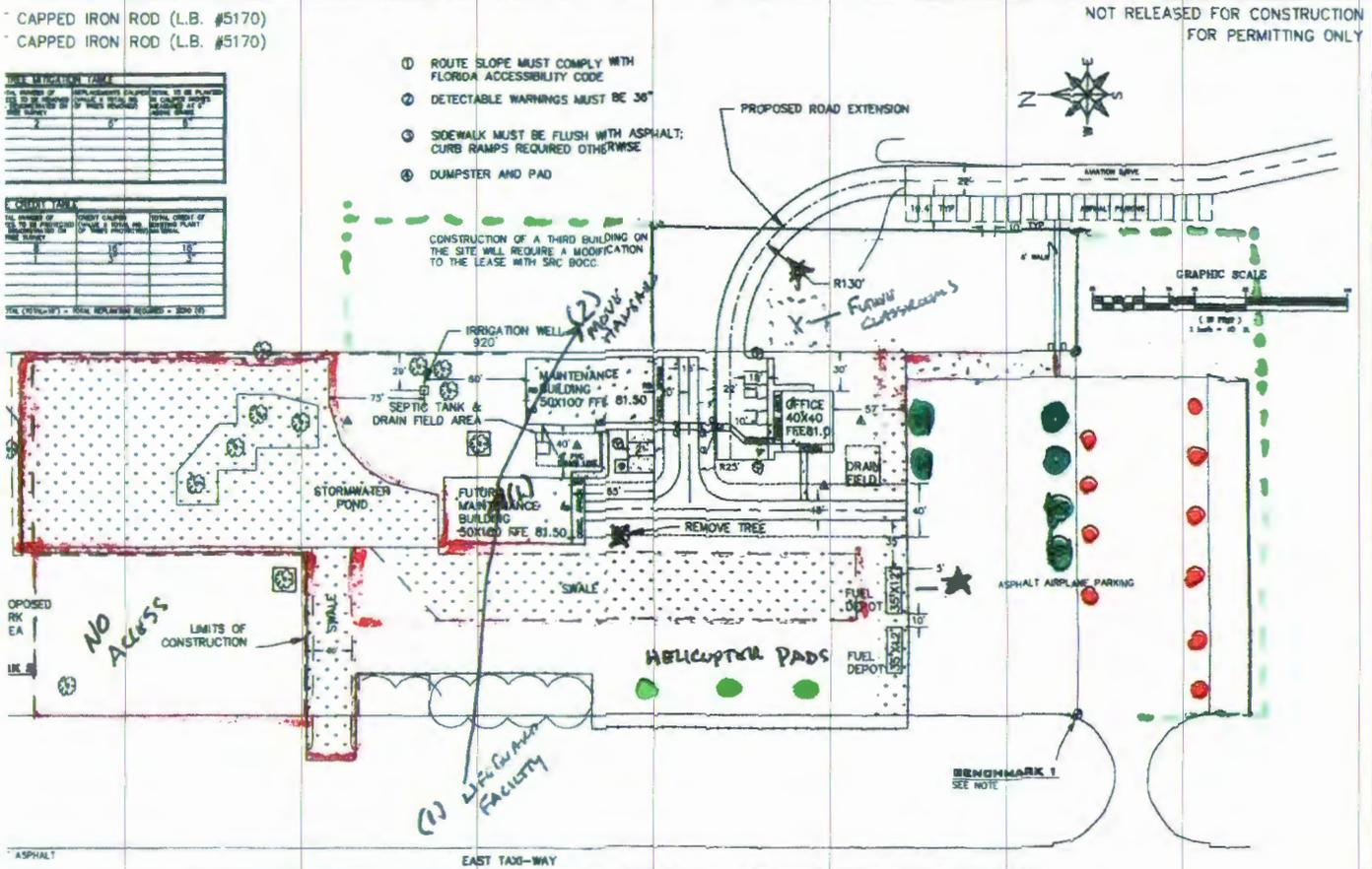

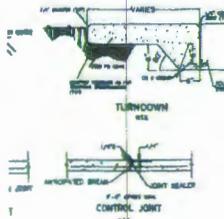

Please find herewith requested info on FAA recognized land lease cost as applied to other airports. The rates are for areas within the airport considered or defined as "For Aeronautical Use and Unimproved Land - with Access", which we deem applies to the referenced area requested by Peter Prince Aviation Center (as shown on the East of the current FBO leased area, shown with green marker) . Kindly note that rates shown below have not been compared to any appraised value (previous or current) that may have been established for Peter Prince Field. FAA policies state that airport properties made available for private use must obtain fair market value, as determined by an appraisal, with leases to bring a fair market return to the airport. All leases at federal funded airports must comply with FAA Order 5190.6B, which includes Sponsor's assurance contained in current grant agreements, which reads in part:

"Sponsor will maintain a fee and rental structure consistent with assurances 22 and 23 for the facilities and services being provided the airport users which will make the airport as self-sustaining as possible under the circumstances existing at that particular airport, taking into account such factors as the volume of traffic and economy of collection."

Industry Standard average (based on static fair market value from 2007):

* Land rental rate (For Aeronautical Use and Unimproved Land - with Access) - \$0.27 - \$0.34 per sf per year or (\$0.0225 - \$0.0283 per sf per month).

The above average rate is based on leases structured on a triple net basis with the lessee paying rent, taxes, insurance and maintenance charges relative to the leased premises. Lease rates are typically flat for five years, and then is adjusted after every 5th year according to the Consumer Price Index for inflation over the five years, but typically capped at no less than 2% per year and no more than 5% per year. Thus, each five years, the minimum rental increase is 10% and maximum of 25%, remaining flat for the next five years until another adjustment. Leases generated between 2007 and 2009 have likely increased by at 10%.

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO SANTA ROSA COUNTY, FLORIDA; AMENDING ORDINANCE 2012-01 THE SANTA ROSA COUNTY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT INCENTIVE ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 3(c) ADDING TANGIBLE PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES; REPEALING AND REPLACING ORDINANCE 2014-04; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; AND, PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SANTA ROSA COUNTY, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. Section 3(c) of Santa Rosa County Ordinance 2012-01 is amended to read as follows: (Language added is printed in type which is **bold underline** type, and language deleted is printed in ~~struck through~~ type.).

“SECTION 3. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT INCENTIVES.

(c) Rebates may be awarded by the Board of County Commissioners for the assessed value of all improvements to real property **and tangible personal property taxes** made by or for the use of the target business that were paid to the County for the year that the business enterprise created the jobs giving rise to the rebate. Nothing herein shall be construed to obligate Santa Rosa County to approve the maximum rebate. The Board of County Commissioners shall have sole discretion to approve each rebate application and the amount of the rebate. Approval of any rebate shall be subject to lawfully available and budgeted funds.”

SECTION 2. Ordinance 2014-04 is hereby repealed and replaced.

SECTION 3. CODIFICATION. The provisions of this ordinance shall become and be made a part of the code of laws and ordinances of the County of Santa Rosa. The sections of this ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such, and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section", "Ordinance", or any other appropriate word.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect upon filing of a certified copy of this Ordinance with the Department of State within ten (10) days after enactment.

WHEREAS, the COUNTY and COASTAL TECH entered into a professional services agreement dated February 24th, 2000; and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY desires COASTAL TECH to perform specific services under such agreement; and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY and COASTAL TECH desire to reduce to writing their understandings and agreements pertaining to such services,

IT IS, THEREFORE, AGREED as follows:

1. Scope of Work: COASTAL TECH shall do, perform and carry out in a satisfactory and proper manner the work set forth in the Scope of Work which is attached hereto and marked as Attachment "A" and hereinafter referred to as "Scope of Work".

2. Compensation: COASTAL TECH shall be paid on the basis established in Attachment "B", provided the compensation under this Supplemental Agreement shall not exceed the sum of \$33,822 without prior authorization of the COUNTY. Such sum shall be the only compensation to which COASTAL TECH is entitled under this Supplemental Agreement.

3. Time: The work shall be performed within the time limit designated in Attachment "C". Time is of the essence in performance of all work under this Supplemental Agreement.

4. Terms and Conditions: All of the terms and conditions contained in the professional services agreement dated February 24, 2000, are incorporated by reference into this Supplemental Agreement. To the extent of any conflict between the terms and conditions of the two agreements, the terms and conditions of this Supplemental Agreement shall govern.

Scope of Work
Supplemental Agreement 2014-1

General: The Navarre Beach & Dune Re-nourishment Project (Project) extends from the eastern limit of the Gulf Islands National Seashore (500 feet east of FDEP reference monument R192) eastward to the Navarre Beach County Park (FDEP reference monument R214) in Santa Rosa County) as previously permitted by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE). The initial Project construction occurred from March to November 2006 and included placement of 2.95M cubic yards of sand obtained from an offshore borrow area.

In general, services under this *Scope of Work* entails physical monitoring as required by the existing permits for the Project. Services shall be provided by Coastal Technology Corporation (COASTAL TECH), and supported (via sub-contract) by Morgan & Eklund, Inc. (M&E) per the following description of work under this *Scope of Work*:

Task 1 – Physical Monitoring

Permit Conditions cited below for Task 1a and 1b refer to existing Project permit conditions cited in either FDEP Permit 0220096-001-JC (issued July 26, 2005, expired July 26, 2010) and/or USACE Permit SAJ-2003-10496-IP-EPS (issued October 13, 2005; expired September 28, 2010).

Task 1a – Survey: As required by FDEP Permit Specific Condition 30a, COASTAL TECH will perform a topographic profile survey of the beach and at three (3) mid-points at R Monuments R208 – R211 in June 2014. COASTAL TECH will sub-contract with M&E for performance of the survey, which shall be analyzed under Task 1b to prepare the Physical Monitoring Report.

Task 1b – Report: As required by FDEP Permit Specific Condition 30d and 30e, COASTAL TECH will prepare and “submit an engineering report and the monitoring data to the Bureau within 90 days following completion of the ... survey”.

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this _____ day of _____, _____ by and between the STATE OF FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, an agency of the State of Florida, hereinafter called the Department, and Santa Rosa County B.O.C.C. hereinafter called the Agency.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Agency has the authority to enter into this Agreement and to undertake the project hereinafter described, and the Department has been granted the authority to function adequately in all areas of appropriate jurisdiction including the implementation of an integrated and balanced transportation system and is authorized under Section 339.12, Florida Statutes, to enter into this Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants, promises and representations herein, the parties agree as follows:

1.00 Purpose of Agreement: The purpose of this Agreement is to provide for the Department's participation in the design of sidewalks along Tiger Point Blvd and as further described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof, hereinafter called the "Project," and to provide Department financial assistance to the Agency and state the terms and conditions upon which such assistance will be provided and the understandings as to the manner in which the Project will be undertaken and completed.

1.01 Attachments: Exhibit(s) A, B, C, & 1 are attached and made a part hereof.

2.01 General Requirements: The Agency shall complete the Project as described in Exhibit "A" with all practical dispatch, in a sound, economical, and efficient manner, and in accordance with the provisions herein, and all applicable laws. The Project will be performed in accordance with all applicable Department procedures, guidelines, manuals, standards, and directives as described in the Department's Local Agency Program Manual, which by this reference is made a part hereof as if fully set forth herein. Time is of the essence as to each and every obligation under this Agreement.

A full time employee of the Agency, qualified to ensure that the work being pursued is complete, accurate, and consistent with the terms, conditions, and specifications of this Agreement shall be in charge of the Project.

Inactivity and Removal of Any Unbilled Funds

Once the Department issues a Notice to Proceed (NTP) for the Project, the Agency shall be obligated to submit an invoice or other request for reimbursement to the Department for all work completed for the Project no less frequently than on a quarterly basis, beginning from the day the NTP is issued. If the Agency fails to submit quarterly (or more frequently than quarterly) invoices to the Department as required herein and in the event said failure to timely submit invoices to the Department results in FHWA removing any unbilled funding or in the loss of State appropriation authority (which may include the loss of state and Federal funds, if there are state funds programmed to the Project), then the Agency will be solely responsible to provide all funds necessary to complete the Project and the Department will not be obligated to provide any additional funding for the Project. The Agency waives the right to contest such removal of funds by the Department, if the removal is related to FHWA's withdrawal of funds or if the removal is related to the loss of State appropriation authority. In addition to the loss of funding for the Project, the Department will also consider the de-certification of the Agency for future LAP Projects.

Removal of All Funds

If all funds are removed from the Project, including amounts previously billed to the Department and reimbursed to the Agency, and the Project is off the state highway system, then the department will have to request repayment for the previously billed amounts from the Agency. No state funds can be used on off-system projects.

2.02 Expiration of Agreement: The Agency agrees to complete the Project on or before June 30, 2015. If the Agency does not complete the Project within this time period, this Agreement will expire on the last day of the scheduled completion as provided in this paragraph unless an extension of the time period is requested by the Agency and granted in writing by the Department prior to the expiration of this Agreement. Expiration of this Agreement will be considered termination of the Project. The cost of any work performed after the expiration date of this Agreement will not be reimbursed by the Department.

2.03 Pursuant to Federal, State, and Local Laws: In the event that any election, referendum, approval, permit, notice or other proceeding or authorization is requisite under applicable law to enable the Agency to enter into this Agreement or to undertake the Project hereunder or to observe, assume or carry out any of the provisions of the Agreement, the Agency will initiate and consummate, as provided by law, all actions necessary with respect to any such matters so requisite.

2.04 Agency Funds: The Agency shall initiate and prosecute to completion all proceedings necessary, including federal-aid requirements, to enable the Agency to provide the necessary funds for completion of the Project.

2.05 Submission of Proceedings, Contracts, and Other Documents: The Agency shall submit to the Department such data, reports, records, contracts, and other documents relating to the Project as the Department and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) may require. The Agency shall use the Department's Local Agency Program Information Tool and applicable information systems as required.

3.00 Project Cost:

3.01 Total Cost: The total cost of the Project is \$ 6,500. This amount is based upon the schedule of funding in Exhibit "B." The Agency agrees to bear all expenses in excess of the total cost of the Project and any deficits involved. The schedule of funding may be modified by mutual agreement as provided for in paragraph 4.00.

3.02 Department Participation: The Department agrees to participate in the Project cost to the extent provided in Exhibit "B." This amount includes federal-aid funds which are limited to the actual amount of federal-aid participation.

3.03 Limits on Department Funds: Project costs eligible for Department participation will be allowed only from the date of this Agreement. It is understood that Department participation in eligible Project costs is subject to:

- a) Legislative approval of the Department's appropriation request in the work program year that the Project is scheduled to be committed;
- b) Availability of funds as stated in paragraphs 3.04 and 3.05 of this Agreement;
- c) Approval of all plans, specifications, contracts or other obligating documents and all other terms of this Agreement; and
- d) Department approval of the Project scope and budget at the time appropriation authority becomes available.

3.04 Appropriation of Funds: The Department's performance and obligation to pay under this Agreement is contingent upon an annual appropriation by the Legislature. If the Department's funding for this Project is in multiple fiscal years, funds approval from the Department's Comptroller must be received each fiscal year prior to costs being incurred. See Exhibit "B" for funding levels by fiscal year. Project costs utilizing these fiscal year funds are not eligible for reimbursement if incurred prior to funds approval being received. The Department will notify the Agency, in writing, when funds are available.

3.05 Multi-Year Commitment: In the event this Agreement is in excess of \$25,000 and has a term for a period of more than one year, the provisions of Section 339.135(6)(a), Florida Statutes, are hereby incorporated:

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this _____ day of _____, _____ by and between the STATE OF FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, an agency of the State of Florida, hereinafter called the Department, and Santa Rosa County B.O.C.C. hereinafter called the Agency.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Agency has the authority to enter into this Agreement and to undertake the project hereinafter described, and the Department has been granted the authority to function adequately in all areas of appropriate jurisdiction including the implementation of an integrated and balanced transportation system and is authorized under Section 339.12, Florida Statutes, to enter into this Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants, promises and representations herein, the parties agree as follows:

1.00 Purpose of Agreement: The purpose of this Agreement is to provide for the Department's participation in the design of mill and resurfacing on CR 184A Berryhill Road and as further described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof, hereinafter called the "Project," and to provide Department financial assistance to the Agency and state the terms and conditions upon which such assistance will be provided and the understandings as to the manner in which the Project will be undertaken and completed.

1.01 Attachments: Exhibit(s) A, B, C, & 1 are attached and made a part hereof.

2.01 General Requirements: The Agency shall complete the Project as described in Exhibit "A" with all practical dispatch, in a sound, economical, and efficient manner, and in accordance with the provisions herein, and all applicable laws. The Project will be performed in accordance with all applicable Department procedures, guidelines, manuals, standards, and directives as described in the Department's Local Agency Program Manual, which by this reference is made a part hereof as if fully set forth herein. Time is of the essence as to each and every obligation under this Agreement.

A full time employee of the Agency, qualified to ensure that the work being pursued is complete, accurate, and consistent with the terms, conditions, and specifications of this Agreement shall be in charge of the Project.

Inactivity and Removal of Any Unbilled Funds

Once the Department issues a Notice to Proceed (NTP) for the Project, the Agency shall be obligated to submit an invoice or other request for reimbursement to the Department for all work completed for the Project no less frequently than on a quarterly basis, beginning from the day the NTP is issued. If the Agency fails to submit quarterly (or more frequently than quarterly) invoices to the Department as required herein and in the event said failure to timely submit invoices to the Department results in FHWA removing any unbilled funding or in the loss of State appropriation authority (which may include the loss of state and Federal funds, if there are state funds programmed to the Project), then the Agency will be solely responsible to provide all funds necessary to complete the Project and the Department will not be obligated to provide any additional funding for the Project. The Agency waives the right to contest such removal of funds by the Department, if the removal is related to FHWA's withdrawal of funds or if the removal is related to the loss of State appropriation authority. In addition to the loss of funding for the Project, the Department will also consider the de-certification of the Agency for future LAP Projects.

Removal of All Funds

If all funds are removed from the Project, including amounts previously billed to the Department and reimbursed to the Agency, and the Project is off the state highway system, then the department will have to request repayment for the previously billed amounts from the Agency. No state funds can be used on off-system projects.

2.02 Expiration of Agreement: The Agency agrees to complete the Project on or before June 30, 2015. If the Agency does not complete the Project within this time period, this Agreement will expire on the last day of the scheduled completion as provided in this paragraph unless an extension of the time period is requested by the Agency and granted in writing by the Department prior to the expiration of this Agreement. Expiration of this Agreement will be considered termination of the Project. The cost of any work performed after the expiration date of this Agreement will not be reimbursed by the Department.

2.03 Pursuant to Federal, State, and Local Laws: In the event that any election, referendum, approval, permit, notice or other proceeding or authorization is requisite under applicable law to enable the Agency to enter into this Agreement or to undertake the Project hereunder or to observe, assume or carry out any of the provisions of the Agreement, the Agency will initiate and consummate, as provided by law, all actions necessary with respect to any such matters so requisite.

2.04 Agency Funds: The Agency shall initiate and prosecute to completion all proceedings necessary, including federal-aid requirements, to enable the Agency to provide the necessary funds for completion of the Project.

2.05 Submission of Proceedings, Contracts, and Other Documents: The Agency shall submit to the Department such data, reports, records, contracts, and other documents relating to the Project as the Department and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) may require. The Agency shall use the Department's Local Agency Program Information Tool and applicable information systems as required.

3.00 Project Cost:

3.01 Total Cost: The total cost of the Project is \$ 119,000. This amount is based upon the schedule of funding in Exhibit "B." The Agency agrees to bear all expenses in excess of the total cost of the Project and any deficits involved. The schedule of funding may be modified by mutual agreement as provided for in paragraph 4.00.

3.02 Department Participation: The Department agrees to participate in the Project cost to the extent provided in Exhibit "B." This amount includes federal-aid funds which are limited to the actual amount of federal-aid participation.

3.03 Limits on Department Funds: Project costs eligible for Department participation will be allowed only from the date of this Agreement. It is understood that Department participation in eligible Project costs is subject to:

- a) Legislative approval of the Department's appropriation request in the work program year that the Project is scheduled to be committed;
- b) Availability of funds as stated in paragraphs 3.04 and 3.05 of this Agreement;
- c) Approval of all plans, specifications, contracts or other obligating documents and all other terms of this Agreement; and
- d) Department approval of the Project scope and budget at the time appropriation authority becomes available.

3.04 Appropriation of Funds: The Department's performance and obligation to pay under this Agreement is contingent upon an annual appropriation by the Legislature. If the Department's funding for this Project is in multiple fiscal years, funds approval from the Department's Comptroller must be received each fiscal year prior to costs being incurred. See Exhibit "B" for funding levels by fiscal year. Project costs utilizing these fiscal year funds are not eligible for reimbursement if incurred prior to funds approval being received. The Department will notify the Agency, in writing, when funds are available.

3.05 Multi-Year Commitment: In the event this Agreement is in excess of \$25,000 and has a term for a period of more than one year, the provisions of Section 339.135(6)(a), Florida Statutes, are hereby incorporated:
