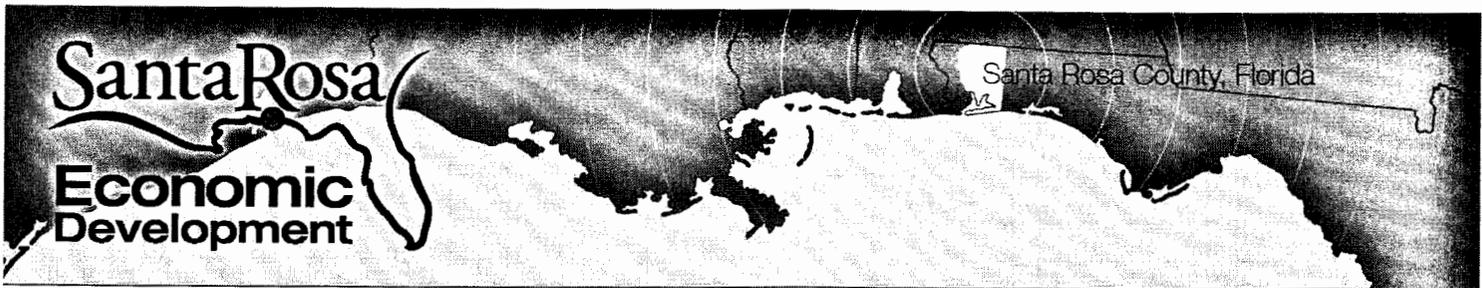

Date: November 10, 2014

RECOMMENDATION

The Santa Rosa EDO is requesting that the Board of County Commissioners authorize staff to advertise for the sale of approximately 2 acres located in the Santa Rosa Industrial Park.

BACKGROUND

Project Titan is a building component manufacturing company that is anticipating hiring 25 employees over a 5 year period. They would like to construct a new 20 sf facility in the Santa Rosa Industrial Park. The anticipated capital investment is \$500,000.

IMPLEMENTATION

In accordance with F.S. 125, the County is required to advertise for the sale of any County owned real property. This recommendation is the first step in this process.

EDO staff will work with the County Attorney to ensure all steps associated with the process are completed as needed.

Hunter,

Attached is the DRG Award Letter for the 2014-2015 year in the amount of \$50,000. The grant agreement has not yet been issued by Enterprise Florida but we do expect that the grant period will cover 11/13/2014-6/30/2015. I would anticipate that it will be delivered prior to the December BOCC meeting.

Based on the available grant funds, I would recommend that the contract with Greystone be renewed through June 30, 2015 in the amount of \$25,330 which is \$1,999 for the prorated month of Nov 13-Nov 30 and \$3,333 each for the months of Dec – June. Additionally, the contract with Barron can be renewed through June 30, 2015 in the total amount of \$2,400 for grant administration services. This leaves \$22,270 available to conduct the military spouse skills inventory and for military related events & functions as requested in the grant application. Attached is the current contracts with Greystone (military consultant) and Barron Consulting (DRG Grant Administrator) for services associated with the recurring DRG grants for reference.

CONTRACT FOR SERVICES

SANTA ROSA COUNTY ("County") and Dedrich C. Hohorst d/b/a Barron Consulting, ("Consultant") enter into this Agreement this 18th day of December, 2013.

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the County to secure and retain the services of the Consultant to act on behalf of the County as a Special Grants Administrator, both parties agree to the following:

I. SCOPE OF WORK

Consultant's duties will include administration and monitoring of County's 2013-14 Florida Defense Reinvestment Grant (DRG), including related research, documentation, reporting and similar duties. Consultant shall perform such other tasks as are mutually agreeable to the parties.

II. TERMS, FEES AND EXPENSES

The term of this agreement shall be from November 13, 2013 through November 12, 2014. This contract may be extended by an additional one (1) year period upon the agreement of both parties.

County shall pay Consultant at the rate of \$50.00 per hour for work performed pursuant to this contract. In no event, however, shall Consultant be compensated more than \$3,500 total for all work performed during the term of this agreement.

III. TERMINATION

This agreement may be terminated by either party upon providing thirty (30) days written notice to the other party.

III. GENERAL PROVISIONS

A. **Governing Law.** This agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the state of Florida, but excluding the conflict of laws thereof.

B. **Assignment.** Neither party may assign any of its rights or delegate any of its duties or obligations under this agreement without the express written consent of either party.

C. **Partial Invalidity.** In the event that any provision of this agreement shall be construed to be illegal or invalid for any reason, said legality or invalidity shall not affect the remaining provisions hereof, but such illegal or invalid provision shall be fully severable and letter agreement shall be construed and enforced as is such illegal and invalid provision had never been included herein.

E. Consultant agrees to indemnify and hold harmless County, its agents, officials, and employees for any and all claims, suits and damages arising out of the operation of this contract.

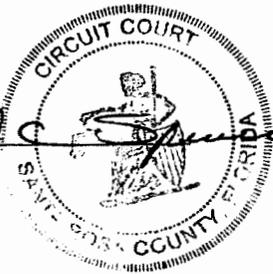

CONTRACT FOR SERVICES

SANTA ROSA COUNTY ("County") and **GREYSTONE CONSULTING, LLC**, a Florida limited liability company, ("Consultant") enter into this Agreement this 14th day of December, 2013.

WHEREAS, it is the desire of County secure and retain the services of the Consultant to act on behalf of County as a Military Affairs Consultant, both parties agree to the following:

I. SCOPE OF WORK

Consultant will perform duties as outlined in the attached Scope of Work and shall perform such other tasks as are mutually agreeable to the parties.

II. TERMS, FEES AND EXPENSES

The term of this agreement shall be from November 13, 2013 through November 12, 2014. This contract may be extended by an additional one (1) year period upon the agreement of both parties.

Fees. County shall compensate Consultant at the rate of \$33,500.00 annually, to be paid in monthly installments.

Third Party Expenses. In addition to fees, County shall reimburse Consultant for costs and out-of-pocket expenses reasonably incurred in connection with the performance of the work, provided the expenses are approved in advance by County.

III. TERMINATION

This agreement may be terminated by either party upon providing thirty (30) days written notice to the other party.

The funding for this contract shall be from a Defense Reinvestment Grant. In the event that County no longer receives said grant, this contract shall terminate.

III. GENERAL PROVISIONS

A. Governing Law. This agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the state of Florida, but excluding the conflict of laws thereof.

B. Assignment. Neither party may assign any of its rights or delegate any of its duties or obligations under this agreement without the express written consent of either party.

C. Partial Invalidity. In the event that any provision of this agreement shall be construed to be illegal or invalid for any reason, said legality or invalidity shall not affect the

remaining provisions hereof, but such illegal or invalid provision shall be fully severable and letter agreement shall be construed and enforced as is such illegal and invalid provision had never been included herein.

D. Entire Agreement. This agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof. It may be changed only by a written agreement signed by the parties.

E. Independent Contractors. Contractor and County are independent entities, and no agency, partnership, franchise, joint venture or employment relationship is intended or created by this Agreement. No party shall make any warranties or representations on behalf of any other party.

F. Contractor agrees to indemnify and hold harmless County, its agents, officials, and employees for any and all claims, suits and damages arising out of the operation of this contract.

SCOPE OF WORK

Consultant shall represent Santa Rosa County in activities concerning DoD, Dept. of the Navy, Dept. of the Air Force and any other armed forces. Consultant shall coordinate tasks and duties that sustain and grow the county's military presence, and participate in activities to enhance those activities that reduce the county's dependence on military (i.e., Whiting Aviation Park). The consultant will provide periodic reports complete with updates and recommendations to the Board of County Commissioners and other entities as directed. The goals of these activities include but are not limited to:

- Placing the county in a BRAC ready position;
- Bettering the county's relationship with military installations, state and other counties;
- Monitoring and interacting as necessary concerning Navy and county progress with respect to initial phases of land swaps and other land dispositions;
- Liaison and interact with military and prospect/existing industries as needed by County;

- Liaison and interact with chamber military affairs committees and congressional offices;

- Provide support and interaction for the multi-county Defense Support Initiative.
- Provide coordination on updating and implementation of the SRC Joint Land Use Study.

Consultant shall also provide support for events and functions that reinforce positive relations between the community and the defense community. These events and functions include:

- Annual fly-in and briefing of the appropriate training and operations Flag Officers to ensure they are aware of the progress the Navy and the county are making to protect and enhance NASWF and other surrounding installations.
- Meetings with military representatives on matters related to workforce, land use, and encroachment, and other issues as necessary; and providing information throughout the community on the positive impacts the military and DoD, its contractors, and its retirees make on the community.
- Facilitate and host, as necessary, community events that recognize the contributions made by the military, further open lines of communication between the military and civilian communities, and promote the education of the civilian and military communities on the benefits gained through active participation with each other.

Consultant shall assist the County Grant Coordinator and/or grant administrator with quarterly reports based on completed objectives and milestones including documentation of expenditures and match as well as final documentation required to close out and complete the grant. This may include coordination or oversight of volunteer hours specifically supporting events and functions that reinforce positive relations between the local community and the defense community.

Find attached information from Finance Director Michael Burton on history and status of the Navarre Beach lease fees. Also attached is the letter from the Florida Office of the Attorney General on this matter.

Navarre Beach Leases Memo

Purpose: To document the understanding of lease fees collected on Navarre Beach properties.

Background:

Santa Rosa County leases the properties on Navarre Beach from Escambia County for \$60,000 of TDT revenues a year. Santa Rosa County in turn leases the land to individuals and/or entities. There are two basic types of leases: residential and commercial. Residential lease can be broken down into Master leases and Additional 5% leases.

Timeline:

1956 – Santa Rosa County began leasing Navarre Beach from Escambia County

1991 – Navarre Beach became part of Santa Rosa County

2001 – Navarre Beach properties became subject to Ad Valorem taxes on improvements.

2001 – Santa Rosa County implemented a lease credit policy.

2002 – A portion of land value was assessed in the value of condo owners' properties.

2006 – Navarre Beach properties became subject to Ad Valorem taxes on land and improvements.

2001-2013 – Navarre Beach leaseholders filed suit over ad valorem taxation.

2014 – Supreme Court ruled in the County's favor of taxation of property values.

Residential Leases

Santa Rosa County has entered into master lease agreements with individuals. The term for these leases is 99 years and is renewable for another 99 years. Individuals who hold these leases can assign their lease to others under the same terms as the original master lease. The lease fees are billed annually based on the anniversary date of the master lease agreement. These leases are eligible for a lease fee credit under the County's lease credit policy passed in 2001.

There are three basic types of residential master leases:

Fixed fee – Provides that the land that is covered by the master lease will incur a fixed lease amount, regardless of the number of assigned leases, developed properties or homes built on the property.

Variable rate – Lease fee is determined as a percentage of the sales price or the assessed value, whichever is greater. The lease fee is initially calculated when the property sells and stays at this rate. In the case of undeveloped property, the lease fee is recalculated once the property is improved.

Ad Valorem – The lease fee is calculated based on the current year's millage rate for ad valorem taxes. This lease fee changes annually.

Additional 5% Leases

Some properties on Navarre Beach have a clause within the original master lease agreement that states that they are required to pay 5% of the revenues collected to Santa Rosa County in the event they rent out their property. These lease fees are not eligible for a lease fee credit.

Commercial Leases

Commercial lease holders are required to submit monthly payments that are based upon a percentage of their gross receipts. These lease fees are not eligible for a lease fee credit.

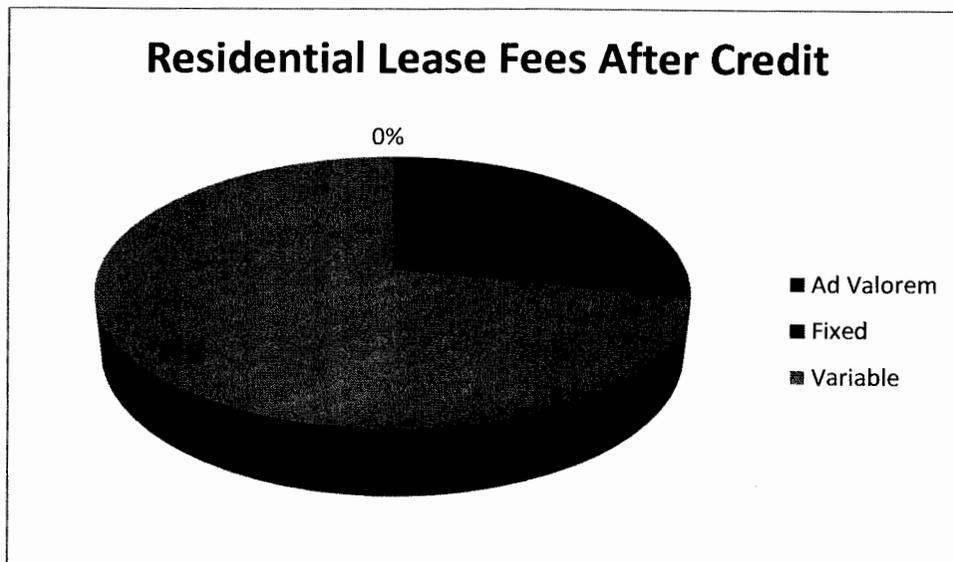

- The form on the right shows what the calculation would have been prior to ad valorem taxation of land in 2006.

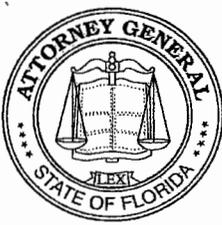

Dear Mr. Andrews:

This office is in receipt of your correspondence of September 26, 2014, requesting an Attorney General's Opinion. Specifically, you have asked "whether the [Santa Rosa] County may validly effectuate the Navarre Beach lease fee policy (a copy of which you attach) or otherwise offset, reduce or eliminate the lease fees payable under the existing leases in light of the payment by the leaseholders of ad valorem taxes." Attorney General Bondi has asked me to respond.

After reviewing the material you have forwarded, it does not appear that this is a matter upon which this office may comment. The Florida Attorney General is statutorily limited to providing legal opinions and advice to governmental agencies on questions of state law relating to their own duties and responsibilities.¹ This office has no authority to review and comment on the validity of local legislation or policy.

In addition, this office addressed a similar question in Attorney General Opinion (AGO) 2008-43 and, in light of the recent Florida Supreme Court case of *Accardo v. Brown*,² would suggest that the discussion and conclusion therein are equally applicable to the situation you present. As AGO 2008-43 states:

While the [Santa Rosa Island] [A]uthority may characterize this payment as an offset of lease fees, the reduction in those fees has the effect of a tax exemption and as such is unconstitutional since such an exemption is not within the provisions of the Florida Constitution.

Further:

This office has previously concluded that exemptions from ad valorem taxation must be strictly construed as found in the Florida Constitution.³ It has been judicially determined that the Constitution, having specified those tax exemptions which are allowed, excludes all others.⁴

That opinion concludes:

[I]t is my opinion that the Santa Rosa Island Authority has no authority to offset lease fees payable to the authority from commercial leaseholders equal to ad valorem taxes collected against commercial leaseholders as such action would amount to an exemption from taxes where the exemption has no constitutional basis.

I trust that these informal comments will assist you in advising your client, the Santa Rosa County Board of Commissioners.

REAL PROPERTY PURCHASE AGREEMENT

THIS PURCHASE AGREEMENT (this "Agreement") is made as of this 2nd day of March, 2014, by **MILTON CROSSINGS, LLC**, a Florida limited liability company (herein "Seller"), and **SANTA ROSA COUNTY**, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, ("Purchaser").

1. **Property.** Seller agrees to sell and convey and Purchaser agrees to purchase and pay for, on the terms and conditions contained in this Agreement, certain real property located in Santa Rosa County, Florida, more particularly described in **Exhibit "A"**, attached hereto as a part hereof, together with all improvements thereon and all rights, privileges, easements and appurtenances thereto, (collectively, the "Property").

2. **Purchase Price.** The purchase price for the Property is \$1,410,768.75 (subject to adjustment as set forth below), payable as follows:

a. \$10,000.00 deposited with Emmanuel, Sheppard & Condon, as Escrow Agent ("Escrow Agent");

b. \$1,400,768.75 (balance of Purchase Price), subject to adjustments and prorations as provided in this Agreement, by certified or cashier's check, payable at the closing and upon delivery of Seller's deed as hereinafter provided.

c. The Purchase Price is based on the tiered purchase prices as outlined in Charter Bank's response to Seller's RFP for Courthouse sites dated November 12, 2013, ("RFP Response"). The Purchase Price stated herein assumes 22.46 acres. The exact legal description for the property will be determined by survey and should the number of actual acres differ, the purchase price shall be adjusted based on the tiered prices outlined in the RFP Response.

3. **Title and Survey Matters.** Within 60 days after the date of this Agreement, Purchaser shall cause a commitment for title insurance (the "Commitment") with respect to the Property in the amount of the Purchase Price to be issued through a title insurer of Purchaser's choice. Purchaser recognizes that Seller is not currently the fee title holder of the Property but has a valid and binding contract to purchase the fee title to the Property plus the adjoining property (defined hereinafter), from Charter Bank (the "Charter Bank Contract"). If the Commitment shows that Charter Bank does not have title to the Property in fee simple, or that the Property is subject to any title defects, liens or mortgages that will not be paid or released at or prior to closing, or to any easements, rights-of-way, covenants, conditions, reservations or restrictions that will impair Purchaser's ability to use the Property for its current use, then Purchaser shall give Seller written notice thereof within 20 days after the date of receipt of the Commitment, or the same shall be deemed to have been waived by

Purchaser. Any such defects, liens, encumbrances, easements, rights-of-way, covenants, reservations or restrictions that are set forth in such written notice are hereinafter referred to as a "Title Objection".

Seller shall have 120 days from the receipt of such notice to remove such title defects, failing which Purchaser shall have the option of either accepting the title as it then is or demanding a refund of deposit(s) paid which shall immediately be returned to Purchaser thereupon, Purchaser and Seller shall release one another of all further obligations under the Contract. Seller shall use his best efforts to correct defects in the title within the time provided for, including the bringing of necessary suits, except that any Title Objection which is a monetary lien that can be satisfied out of the closing proceeds will be so satisfied.

Seller shall obtain a survey of the Property as soon as possible after the date of this Agreement, and will furnish a copy of the same to Purchaser. Any defect disclosed by such survey will be treated the same as a title defect, such that if Purchaser gives notice thereof to Seller within 20 days after the date of receipt of the survey, such defect will be considered a Title Objection; otherwise, the same shall be deemed to have been waived by Purchaser.

4. **Conveyance.** At the closing, Seller shall execute and deliver to Purchaser the following documents:

a. Its general statutory warranty deed, conveying to Purchaser marketable title to the Property in fee simple, free and clear of all liens and encumbrances except the following (the "Permitted Exceptions"): (a) real estate taxes and assessments which are not due and payable as of the date of the closing, (b) all easements and rights of way, whether or not written or of record, (c) all covenants, conditions, reservations and restrictions of record, (d) rights of tenants in possession, and (e) building, zoning, land use and environmental laws, statutes, ordinances, codes, resolutions and regulations;

b. A non-foreign seller affidavit;

c. A standard seller's title affidavit with respect to parties in possession, construction liens and unrecorded or intervening title matters.

5. **Prorations and Expenses.** Real estate taxes, impounds and assessments will be prorated at closing based on the most recent tax bills available.

6. **Closing Costs.** Seller shall pay for the expense of a boundary survey, settlement fee real estate professionals' fee (if any) and for documentary stamps on the deed. Purchaser shall pay title insurance search fees, and premiums and all recording fees. Each party shall pay their respective attorney's fees.

7. **Closing.** The closing for the payment of the purchase price and delivery of

Seller's deed shall be held at a location of Purchaser's choice, on or before December 31, 2014.

8. **Possession.** Exclusive possession of the Property shall be delivered to Purchaser at the closing, subject to the Permitted Exceptions.

9. **Due Diligence Period.** Seller shall make the Property available for inspection by Purchaser during the first one hundred fifty (150) days after the date of this Agreement (the "Due Diligence Period"), and Purchaser may, at Purchaser's sole risk and expense, undertake an inspection of the Property during that time, and to make such market and feasibility studies, soil borings and tests as Purchaser deems necessary to determine the suitability of the Property for the purchase contemplated herein, provided such tests do not materially damage the Property materially.

Purchaser shall have the right to examine all documents, records and other matters and things related to the Property, including permits, any existing survey or existing title insurance policies, easement agreements, leases, copies of service contracts, warranties, utility servicing agreements, zoning classification and all other documents or items relating to the construction, operation, occupancy and maintenance of the Property. Seller shall make available to the Purchaser, within 10 days following the acceptance of this Agreement, all of the items herein described which are within the possession or control of Seller so as to facilitate Purchaser's prompt and full evaluation of the Property.

Purchaser shall indemnify and hold harmless Seller from all claims, liabilities, costs and expenses incurred by Seller and arising from any entry on or activities conducted upon the Property by Purchaser or its officers, employers or contractors. If Purchaser is not satisfied in its sole discretion with the results of its inspection of the Property, Purchaser may terminate this Agreement by giving written notice of termination to Seller by not later than the expiration date of the Due Diligence Period, and upon such termination, the earnest money deposit shall be returned to Purchaser and both parties shall thereupon be relieved of all further obligation and liability under this Agreement. Purchaser shall keep the results of all such environmental inspections confidential, except to the extent required by law.

Seller states that they are not aware of any condition of the property which might cause the property to be in violation of any state or federal environmental rules, regulations or laws.

10. **Representations as to Environmental and Hazardous Wastes.** Seller represents that, to the best of its knowledge, without inquiry, the following statements are true and correct:

a. **Environmental.** No hazardous or toxic materials, substances,

pollutants contaminants or wastes have been released disposed of at, on or near the Property, nor has the Property been used at any time by any person as a landfill of a waste disposal site.

b. **Hazardous Wastes.** There are no hazardous substances as defined by the Comprehensive Environmental U.S.C. 9602(14), pollutants or contaminants as defined in CERCLA, 42 U.S.C. 9604(A)(2), or hazardous wastes as defined in the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act ("RCRA"), 42 U.S.C. Sec. 6903(5), or other similar applicable federal or state laws and regulations, including regulations, including, but not limited to, asbestos, PCBs and urea formaldehyde, have been generated, released, stored or deposited over, beneath or on the Property or on or in any structures located on the Property from any source whatsoever by Seller, its predecessors in interest in the Property or any other person.

c. **Environmental Assessments.** During the term of this contract, Seller shall supply to Purchaser copies of any environmental studies, audits, reports or the like which come into its possession. Such copies shall be supplied within ten (10) days of Seller's receipt thereof.

11. **Risk of Loss and Condemnation.** The risk of loss or damage to the Property from casualty or condemnation prior to the Closing shall be borne by the Seller.

12. **Ingress and Egress.** Seller warrants and represents that there is ingress and egress to the Real Property sufficient for its intended use.

13. **Sale Contingencies.** The parties understand and agree that Purchaser has entered into this contract with the intent of constructing a courthouse or judicial facility on the Property and that such construction shall be financed by a sales tax in Santa Rosa County, Florida, which would have to be passed by referendum of the electorate. This contract is contingent upon passage of the said sales tax referendum. In the event that the contemplated sales tax referendum fails, or is not placed on the ballot for any reason or if the contemplated sales tax is not implemented for any reason, then, at the option of the Purchaser, this contract shall expire and Purchaser's earnest money deposit shall be refunded to it. This contingency need not (and shall not) be completed within the Due Diligence Period otherwise outlined in this Agreement but must be satisfied by November 21, 2014.

This contract is further contingent upon Purchaser obtaining, during the Investigation Period, conditional use approval for the construction of a courthouse on the Property. In the event that such approval is not sought or is not granted during the Investigation Period, then, at the option of the Purchaser, this contract shall expire and Purchaser's earnest money deposit shall be refunded to it.

Further, the parties acknowledge that the intended use of this property by the Purchaser is for a courthouse or judicial facility. If at any time prior to November 21, 2014, Purchaser shall determine, in its sole discretion that the property is unsuitable or unacceptable for use as a courthouse or judicial facility, then it may cancel this contract without penalty and Purchaser's earnest money deposit shall be refunded to it.

14. **Notices.** Any notice required or permitted to be given to a party under this Agreement, shall be deemed given when received if sent by any of the following means: U.S. certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested; reputable overnight courier; facsimile transmission; or hand delivery; addressed as follows:

Either party may, from time to time, change its mailing address by written notice to the other party at its then current mailing address in accordance with the provisions of this Paragraph

15. **Binding Effect: No Assignment.** This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of Seller and Purchaser and their respective successors and assigns. Purchaser may assign its rights under this Agreement to any third party, provided Purchaser gives written notice thereof to Seller.

16. **Entire Agreement: Governing Law.** This Agreement, together with all exhibits hereto and any other documents executed and delivered pursuant to the provisions hereof, contains the entire agreement of the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter hereof. No representations, inducements, promises or agreements, oral or otherwise, between the parties not embodied herein or in such letter of understanding will be of any force or effect unless contained in a written amendment to this Agreement executed by both Seller and Purchaser. This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida.

17. **Default.** In the event Purchaser fails or refuses to close the purchase of the Property and pay the purchase price in accordance with this Agreement, Seller's sole remedy will be to notify Escrow Agent to pay the earnest money deposit to Seller, and immediately upon receipt of such notice, Escrow Agent will pay the deposit. If for any reason Seller fails or refuses to close the purchase of the Property in accordance with this Agreement, other than failure of Seller to make Seller's title marketable as required above, Purchaser may seek specific performance of this Agreement or elect to receive the return of Purchaser's deposit(s) without thereby waiving any action for damages resulting from Seller's breach.

18. **Attorneys' Fees.** In the event any dispute between the parties hereto should result in litigation, the prevailing party will be reimbursed for all reasonable costs, fees and expenses incurred by the prevailing party in connection therewith, including, but not by way of limitation, reasonable attorneys' and legal assistants' fees before trial, at trial, after trial, on appeal and in bankruptcy proceedings.

19. **Counterparts.** This Agreement may be executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument, and in making proof hereof, it shall not be necessary to produce or account for more than one counterpart.

20. **Time is of Essence.** Time is of the essence of all provisions of this Agreement. If the last day of any period of time specified in this Agreement falls on a weekend or legal holiday, such period shall be extended through the end of the next business day.

21. **Development Cooperation.** The parties hereto recognize that Seller, as owner of adjoining property ("Adjoining Property") lying west of the Property, intends to develop such Adjoining Property in the future. The parties further recognize that the timing of the development on the Adjoining Property and the Property may not occur simultaneously and also recognize that it may be to the mutual benefit of both parties to share the benefits, burden and expenses of certain improvements to be constructed on the Adjoining Property and the Property. Accordingly, the parties hereto agree that each will adhere to the Santa Rosa County Land Development Code as it pertains to interconnectivity among commercial developments and shall strive to provide in favor of the other reciprocal easements for ingress and egress over paved and designated driveways as such are developed or relocated from time to time on the Adjoining Property and the Property. Further, Purchase and Seller acknowledge that a single shared storm water retention facility may be beneficial to allow for the maximum development of both parcels and therefore agree that the first of Seller or Purchaser to develop their respective parcels, shall strive to place such storm water retention facility at a location to allow for expansion to serve the second property to be developed. The cost of all such expansion shall be borne by the party conducting such expansion work.

In furtherance of the foregoing agreements regarding development, each party agrees to provide to the other, upon request, the proposals for the design of site improvements on their respective properties as such are created from time to time.

All of the provisions of this Section 21 shall survive closing and be binding on the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns.

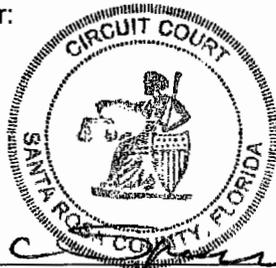

- Ranchettes, Northridge and Whisper Bay Subdivisions Drainage Improvements (Tier 1)
- Villa Venyce Subdivision Drainage Improvements (Tier 1)
- Patterson Lane and Pace Lane Drainage Improvements (Tier 2)
- Maranatha Way and Chipper Lane Drainage Improvements (Tier 2)

On October 23, 2014, the Santa Rosa County Local Mitigation Strategy (LMS) conditionally approved the above-listed projects for Tier 1 and Tier 2 funding associated with the Florida Severe Storms, Tornadoes, Straight-line Winds, and Flooding allocation (FEMA-4177-DR-FL). Note that based on the initial 90-day estimate published by FEMA on September 17, 2014, and later revised in October 2014, Santa Rosa County will receive a Federal allocation of \$2,125,401, which corresponds to a 75% match based on a total County allocation of \$2,883,868.

Based on coordination with County staff, we understand that the projected total costs of the projects will be as stated in the following table. Moreover, it is anticipated that FEMA will allocate a 75% Federal match and Santa Rosa County will fund the remaining 25% project cost. It should be pointed out that if the City of Gulf Breeze's project is determined to be cost effective, the remaining Tier 1 funds will cover the first three projects in the following table. However, if the Gulf Breeze project is not determined to be cost effective, then the four County projects can potentially be covered by Tier 1 funding, fully or partially, depending on the final project costs.

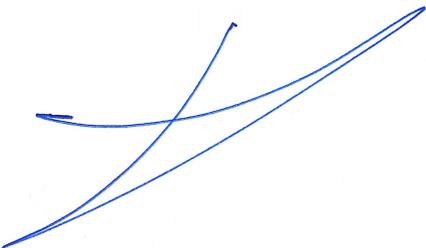
In order to "secure" the 75% match from FEMA, HMGP applications must be prepared and submitted to DEM on or before January 6, 2015.

This Agreement is entered into on _____, 2014, by the **Santa Rosa County, Florida**, (hereinafter referred to as the "County"), a municipal corporation of the State of Florida with the address of 6495 Caroline Street, Milton, Fl 32570 and the **West Florida Regional Planning Council** (hereinafter referred to as the "Council"), an agency of the State of Florida with the address of Post Office Box 11399, Pensacola, Florida 32524-1399. The purpose of this Agreement is to provide the basis under which the County and the Council agree to cooperate in preparing the Small Quantity Hazardous Waste Assessment, Notification and Verification program (hereinafter called the SQG Program) consistent with Florida Statutes Chapter 403.7226.

The parties to this Agreement believe it is in the public interest that the County and the Council cooperatively seek to undertake, perform and complete the inspections and reports on local businesses generating hazardous waste as required by state regulations. The County has determined that this Agreement is the most cost-effective method for the County to procure the services required to complete the inspections and reports in accordance with state regulations;

In consideration of the mutual covenants and promises contained herein, the County and Council agree as follows:

1.00 SCOPE OF SERVICES

1.01 The Council shall provide the Required Services identified in Attachment A.

1.02 Required Services shall be made pursuant to and as required by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection specified under Chapter 403.7226 F.S.

2.00 SCHEDULES AND TIME CONSTRAINTS

2.01 This Agreement shall be effective when signed by both County and Council and shall remain in effect until September 30, 2015, unless (i) a party terminates this Agreement without cause prior to such end date pursuant to Section 8.01 or (ii) a party terminates this Agreement with Cause prior to such end date pursuant to Section 8.02.

2.02 In regard to Required Services, the Council shall provide the County with project deliverables in a timely manner pursuant to their required due dates.

2.03 The County shall promptly respond to Council's reasonable requests for information in order to allow the Council to perform the agreed Scope of Services in a timely manner.

3.00 COMPENSATION

3.01 The Council will perform the Required Services described in Attachment A for the cost of \$12,300.00.

3.02 If either the Council or the County terminates this Agreement, the Council shall determine the unbilled amount of work performed up to and including the date of termination and will issue a final invoice for (i) such unbilled work, based on the amounts and rates provided in Attachment A, and (ii) all amounts previously billed and unpaid.

4.00 METHOD OF PAYMENT

The parties will adhere to the following procedures concerning payment for Council's services under this Agreement:

4.01 Determination of the amounts payable to the Council shall be as stated in Section 3.00 and Attachment A of this Agreement.

4.02 The invoice will be signed by the Executive Director of the Council as to its correctness.

4.03 The invoice will be accompanied by a progress report and such other documentation as may reasonably be required by the County.

4.04 County's payment to the Council must be made within thirty (30) days after the County's receipt of a properly filed and correct invoice.

4.05 The County may withhold payment until questions of accuracy and correctness are cleared up to its reasonable satisfaction.

5.00 WORK PRODUCTS

5.01 The Council shall provide the materials required to perform the Required Services listed on Attachment A. Data and materials provided to the Council by the County remain the property of the County and shall be returned to the County upon termination of this Agreement or within thirty (30) days after County's written notice requesting the return of information. All other data and materials gathered, compiled or prepared by the Council are property of the Council and shall not be subject to disclosure to the County or other persons or entities, except to the extent required by law.

5.02 The parties acknowledge that this Agreement and related documents may be subject to disclosure pursuant to Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, as amended. In the event a party fails to comply with Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, the other party may provide such documents as required by Chapter 119, Florida Statutes.

6.00 COOPERATION

6.01 The following individuals shall be the primary contact persons under this Agreement:

7.00 HOLD HARMLESS

7.01 County and Council and their respective elected officials, representatives, employees, agents and officers shall not be deemed to assume any liability for the acts, omissions or negligence of the other party. The Council and the County agree to be fully responsible for their own acts or omissions which result in claims or suits and agree to indemnify and hold the other party harmless for such acts or omissions. However, Council shall not be obligated to indemnify or hold County (or its elected officials,

representatives, employees, agents and officers) harmless from and against any claim, demand, cost and damages relating in any manner to erroneous information provided by the County, its elected officials, representatives, employees, agents and officers.

7.02 The County shall indemnify and hold the Council (and its elected officials, representatives, employees, agents and officers) harmless for all claims, demands, costs and damages, including attorneys' fees, in connection with the County's methods and manner of implementation of Council's recommendations, designs or interpretations. In addition, County shall indemnify and hold Council (and its elected officials, representatives, employees, agents and officers) harmless from and against all claims, demands, costs and damages, including attorneys' fees, relating in any manner to erroneous information provided by the County, its elected officials, representatives, employees, agents and officers.

8.00 TERMINATION

8.01 Termination Without Cause. This Agreement may be terminated without cause by either the County or the Council, by giving written notice to the other party sixty (60) calendar days before such termination. Unless otherwise mutually agreed to in writing, the Council shall continue to perform its services during the sixty-day period preceding termination. Council shall be entitled to payment for services performed and expenses incurred through the date of termination, as well as a fee of \$ 0.00 (the "Termination Fee").

8.02 Termination for Cause. If either County or Council believes that an event has occurred that is described in Section 8.03 as "Cause," it shall provide the other party with written notice thereof (the "Cause Notice"). Upon receipt of a written assertion of the Cause Notice, the party in receipt of such notice shall have 15 calendar days after the receipt of the Cause Notice (the "Cure Period") to cure the asserted Cause. If the Cure Period expires without the curing of the Cause asserted for termination, the party alleging the occurrence of Cause shall notify the other party in writing of the failure to cure the asserted Cause and the termination of this Agreement (the "Termination Notice"). This Agreement shall terminate immediately upon the receipt of a Termination Notice by either party, unless otherwise mutually agreed upon in writing. Upon receipt of a Termination Notice, the Council shall cease all

performance under this Agreement. At that time, the Council shall be entitled to payment for services performed and expenses incurred as of the receipt of the Termination Notice, as well as a fee of \$ 0.00 (the "Termination Fee").

8.03 "Cause" shall be defined as follows:

- a) County's non-payment of a correct invoice after ninety (90) days;
- b) The Council's noncompliance with the nondiscrimination provisions of this Agreement;
- c) Either party fails to comply with the requirements of Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, regarding the provision of public records;
- d) The provision of the Scope of Services becomes illegal, impractical or impossible through no fault of the Council or the County; or
- e) A material breach of this Agreement by either party.

8.04 Upon receipt of any termination notice, with or without cause, under this Section 8, the Council shall have the right to send an invoice to the County with a non-binding estimate of fees and costs expected to be incurred by the Council through the date of termination, without prejudice to any invoice later submitted should actual charges differ from the estimated amounts. County must submit any objection to this non-binding estimate to the Council in writing within ten (10) days of the County's receipt of such estimate.

9.00 SUPPLEMENTAL AND PRIOR AGREEMENTS

9.01 It is understood and agreed that no supplemental agreement of any nature may be entered into by the parties hereto with regard to the work to be performed hereunder without the signed written agreement of the County and the Council, anything to the contrary in this Agreement notwithstanding.

9.02 This Agreement supersedes all prior negotiations, correspondence, conversations, agreements or understandings applicable to matters contained herein, and no deviations from this Agreement shall be predicated upon any prior representations of either party, whether oral or written.

13.00 GOVERNING LAW

13.01 This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida and exclusive venue of all disputes (if any) shall be in the Santa Rosa County, State of Florida.

Recommendation

Recommend the Board enter into a contractual agreement with Motorola to provide a comprehensive 700/800 MHz trunked system and authorize the Chairman to sign all related documents.

Recommend the Board approve an inter-local agreement with Escambia County for the use of P25 Master Core and appropriate tower space.

The Motorola agreement is contingent upon a fully executed agreement with Escambia County and an executed agreement with Santa Rosa County Schools System for a tower location to be situated at the old Munson School.

Background

This capital project was discussed at the June 12 and October 9, 2014 regular meetings of the BOCC. Staff was directed to move forward with the necessary steps to enter into negotiation with Motorola for contract terms and pricing as outlined at the October meeting. In addition, staff was tasked with requesting formal agreement terms with Escambia County for a joint project to be ratified by the Board this month.

Summary of Agreement

1. System Cost: \$7,279,240 based on Government Contract Pricing
2. Payments: \$1 million due on installation of Fixed Network Equipment(FNE) (approximate date 08/31/15); \$1 million due on acceptance of the system (approximate date 01/29/16) and balance in the amount of \$5,729,240 financed for 7 years at 1.79% interest with annual payments in the amount of \$809,011. Interest rate is well below market rate.
3. Upgrade of the Escambia P25 Master Core
4. Construction of 300 ft. self-supporting tower at the old Munson School site and associated Fixed Network Equipment

5. Fixed Network Equipment replacement at the three current tower sites and installation of new equipment installation at two Escambia County tower sites
6. 15 dispatch console replacements at Santa Rosa County Emergency Communications Center, Sheriff's Office, Milton PD and Gulf Breeze PD communication centers
7. Microwave Point-to-Point connection from SRC tower to Scenic Heights tower

SYSTEM DESCRIPTION

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Motorola is pleased to provide the following proposal for Santa Rosa County. Escambia County has recently migrated to a P25 Digital Platform, and the purpose of this project is to leverage the Escambia County P25 Core by connecting new P25 RF sites for Santa Rosa County. The Escambia County core supports their P25 UHF Conventional system. Motorola is proposing a robust, standards-based (Project 25 compliant) 700/800 MHz trunked radio system featuring capacity and scalability for Santa Rosa County.

The system design consists of upgrading Escambia County's existing 7.9 M2 Digital Conventional Core to support Trunking by adding the appropriate licenses and software. The proposal for Escambia County will upgrade the Escambia Core to the latest version of Motorola's ASTRO25 platform – 7.15. This will provide full APCO TDMA capability. Upgrading Escambia's Core is significantly more cost effective than Santa Rosa County purchasing their own Core or Master Site. Additionally, cost sharing of maintenance garners further on-going cost savings for all three entities.

The Master Site contains the required components needed to manage and control the system, and to distribute the signals out to each of the five new RF sites of Santa Rosa County. New dispatch Consoles will be added to the Santa Rosa County 911 and Santa Rosa County Sheriff's Office dispatch centers. Additionally, the proposal will replace the existing Dispatch Consoles at the City of Milton, and the City of Gulf Breeze. All of the new RF and Dispatch infrastructure will be connected back to the Master Site through a network of new and existing microwave links as well as county owned fiber optic network.

The Escambia Master Site consists of a M2 ASTRO P25 Core which will support a combined total of 25 RF and dispatch sites. The M2 Master Site consists of redundant Zone Controllers and data base servers to ensure the operational integrity of the system reliability during disasters or unexpected failures of site equipment.



INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN SANTA ROSA COUNTY AND ESCAMBIA COUNTY FOR SHARED USE OF COMMUNICATIONS INFRASTRUCTURE

This Interlocal Agreement (hereinafter "Agreement") is made and entered into this ___ day of _____, 2014, by and between Santa Rosa County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, acting through its Board of County Commissioners (hereinafter "Santa Rosa"), with an administrative address of 6495 Caroline Street, Milton, Florida 32570, and Escambia County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, acting through its Board of County Commissioners (hereinafter "Escambia"), with an administrative address of P.O. Box 1591, Pensacola, Florida 32597.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Escambia and Santa Rosa have legal authority to perform general governmental services within their respective jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to §§163.01, Florida Statutes, et seq., Escambia and Santa Rosa are authorized to enter into interlocal agreements and cooperatively utilize their powers and resources in the most efficient manner possible; and

WHEREAS, Escambia and Santa Rosa desire to enter into this Agreement setting forth the terms whereby the parties shall cooperatively utilize certain communications infrastructure owned by Escambia County for the purpose of supporting an interoperable P-25 public safety radio communications system.

NOW THEREFORE, for an in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein and the mutual benefits and for other good and valuable consideration, the parties to this Agreement hereby agree as follows:

Section 1. Recitals. The recitals contained in the Preamble of this Agreement are declared to be true and correct and are incorporated into this Agreement.

Section 2. Purpose of the Agreement. Pursuant to §§163.01, Florida Statutes, et seq., this Agreement establishes the conditions, extent, and mechanism whereby the parties shall cooperatively utilize certain communications infrastructure owned by Escambia County for the purpose of supporting an interoperable P-25 public safety communications system.

Section 3. Definitions. **P-25 public safety radio communications system:** The digital radio system that provides for communications to all Escambia County Public Safety entities, to include Emergency Communications Center, ECFR, EMS, and ECSO. The P25 system hardware includes; computer servers, base station radios, mobile and portable radios, site routers, microwave towers, microwave radios and dishes, and transmit/receive antennas.

P25 Master Core: The Master Core is housed at the Escambia Public Safety Building located at 6575 North "W" Street. "Core" hardware includes servers, routers, and computer switches associated with processing, routing and managing digital radio transmissions. **User Configuration Server (UCS):** Database management server used for creating and managing radio "talk groups" within the communications system.

Section 4. Responsibilities of the Parties.

The Parties shall cooperatively establish a technical means whereby Santa Rosa may operate six (6) Motorola P-25 radio sites utilizing Escambia's P25 Master Core. Escambia's existing **User Configuration Server (UCS)** will serve as the primary database server for all user configurations.

Escambia shall provide authorized Santa Rosa staff reasonable access to the UCS for user and system configuration.

Santa Rosa will provide a reliable network connection (microwave, fiber, wireless, common carrier and/or other means) between the Santa Rosa and Escambia network systems and shall, at all times, be responsible for maintaining network connectivity to the UCS.

Escambia will provide Santa Rosa with component rack and antenna mounting space for network connectivity at the Don Sutton Microwave Tower Site located at 2340B Crabtree Church Road. Additionally, Escambia will provide rack space only at the Englewood Microwave Tower Site equipment shelter located at 1218 West Cross Street.

The Parties shall take appropriate measures to prevent the programming of unauthorized radio communications within their respective jurisdictions.

The Parties shall cooperatively define and document preprogrammed interoperable talk groups within each jurisdiction in order to facilitate interoperability during disaster responses. Any other preprogrammed interoperable talk groups crossing jurisdictional boundaries shall require prior written authorization.

The Parties agree to work cooperatively to determine a mutually agreeable operational plan in the event of any system wide upgrades relating to the Master Core. Each Party will be solely responsible for any costs or expenses related to modification, repair, or replacement of their respective components that maybe required to accommodate system wide upgrades

The Parties shall at all times maintain their respective components in good working order. Each Party will be solely responsible for any maintenance costs or expenses related to repair or replacement requirements.

Section 5. Independence of Operations. The Parties hereto shall at all times maintain independent P-25 radio services within their respective jurisdictions.

Section 6. Service Agreement. Escambia previously entered into a Fixed Equipment Service Agreement with Motorola Solutions, Inc., to provide network support services for Escambia's P-25 public safety communications system. (See Motorola Services Agreement and Customer Support Plan, attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A.) If said Service Agreement is terminated or modified, Escambia shall provide notice of such termination or modification to Santa Rosa.

Section 7. Maintenance Fee. In exchange for the use of Escambia's Motorola Master Core and existing UCS, Santa Rosa agrees to pay one half of the monthly recurring service fee for the Fixed Equipment Service associated with the Master Core as provided by Motorola Solutions, Inc., pursuant to the Motorola Services Agreement and Customer Support Plan attached as Exhibit A.

Section 8. Permits. The performance by either party under this Agreement shall be subject to and contingent upon receipt of all permits or other federal, state or local governmental authorizations ("Permits") necessary for the use of the Facilities and Equipment, including, but not limited to, any building permits, zoning allowances, variances, special use permits or other permits.

Section 9. Compliance with Laws. The Parties agrees to comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules, policies, or guidelines related to the performance of this Agreement now in effect or hereafter enacted as the same may apply to the use of the Facilities and Equipment, and shall obtain any necessary licenses, permits and other approvals required of the use of said Facilities and Equipment. The Parties further agree to cooperate in obtaining such licenses, permits, and approvals. Each Party shall be responsible for compliance with all FCC and/or OSHA radio frequency rules and regulations as they pertain to each Party's respective components of the Facilities and Equipment

Section 11. Effective Date. This Agreement, after being properly executed by all parties named herein, shall become effective upon its filing with the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Escambia County, Florida. Escambia County shall be responsible for filing this document upon receipt of the executed Agreement.

Section 12. Term. This Agreement shall commence upon the effective date and continue for a term of 10 years. Thereafter, this Agreement shall automatically renew for additional, successive twelve month periods until terminated by either party as provided herein.

Section 13. Termination. Either party may terminate this agreement with or without cause upon providing at least three hundred sixty-five (365) days prior written notice to the non-terminating party. Such termination shall be effective three hundred sixty-five (365) days following the receipt of such notice by the non-terminating party.

Section 14. Removal/Separation. Within one hundred and eighty (180) days after the effective date of termination, the Parties shall separate all network system configurations. Each Party will be solely responsible for any costs or expenses related to modification, repair, or replacement of their respective facilities and equipment as may be necessitated by the system separation.

Section 15. Liability. Subject to any claim of sovereign immunity, each Party to this Agreement shall be fully liable for the acts and omissions of its respective employees and agents in the performance of this Agreement to the extent permitted by law.

Section 16. Records. The parties acknowledge that this Agreement and any related financial records, audits, reports, plans, correspondence, and other documents may be subject to disclosure to members of the public pursuant to Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, as amended. In the event a party fails to abide by the provision of Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, the other party may, without prejudice to any right or remedy and after giving that party, seven (7) days written notice, during which period the party fails to allow access to such documents, terminate this Agreement.

Section 17. Assignment. The Agreement, or any interest herein, shall not be assigned, transferred, or otherwise encumbered, under any circumstances, by the Parties, without the prior written consent of the other party.

Section 18. Headings. Headings and subtitles used throughout this Agreement are for the purpose of convenience only, and no heading or subtitle shall modify or be used to interpret the text of any section.

Section 19. Survival. All other provisions, which by their inherent character, sense, and context are intended to survive termination of this Agreement, shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

Section 20. Interpretation.

(a) For the purpose of this Agreement, the singular includes the plural and the plural shall include the singular. References to statutes or regulations shall include all statutory or regulatory provisions consolidating, amending, or replacing the statutes or regulations referred to. Words not otherwise defined that have well-known technical or industry meanings, are used in accordance with such recognized meanings.

(b) References to persons include their respective permitted successors and assigns and, in the case of governmental persons, persons succeeding to their respective functions and capacities. This Agreement shall not be more strictly construed against either party hereto by reason of the fact that one party may have drafted or prepared any or all of the terms and provision hereof.

Section 21. Severability. The invalidity or non-enforceability of any portion or provision of this Agreement shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other portion or

I am a county [official/staff/title] and I am writing on the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) proposed rule regarding *Definition of Waters of the U.S. Under the Clean Water Act*, Docket No. EPA-HQ-OW-2011-0880. This proposed rule was released on April 21, it would amend the definition of “waters of the U.S.” and expand the range of waters that fall under federal jurisdiction.

Counties are tasked with the heavy responsibility to protect the health, welfare, and safety of their citizens, as well as maintain and improve their quality of life. This includes protecting of valuable water resources, whether as a regulated entity or regulator, to ensure that the nation’s waters remain clean.

I am very concerned that the proposed rule would modify existing regulations, which have been in place for over 25 years. **Because the proposed rule could expand the scope of CWA jurisdiction, counties could feel a major impact as more waters become federally protected and subject to new rules or standards.**

The proposed “waters of the U.S.” regulation from EPA and the Corps could have a significant impact on counties across the country, in the following ways:

- **Seeks to define waters under federal jurisdiction:** The proposed rule would modify existing regulations, which have been in place for over 25 years, regarding which waters fall under federal jurisdiction through the Clean Water Act (CWA). Because the proposed rule could expand the scope of CWA jurisdiction, counties could feel a major impact as more waters become federally regulated and subject to new rules or standards.

- **Potentially increases the number of county-owned ditches under federal regulation:** The proposed rule would define some ditches as “waters of the U.S.” if they meet certain conditions. This means that more county-owned ditches would likely fall under federal oversight. In recent years, Section 404 permits have been required for ditch maintenance activities such as cleaning out vegetation and debris. **Once a ditch is under federal jurisdiction, the Section 404 permit process can be extremely cumbersome, time-consuming and expensive, leaving counties vulnerable to citizen suits if the federal permit process is not streamlined.**
- **Applies to all Clean Water Act programs, not just Section 404 program:** The proposed rule would apply not just to Section 404 permits, but also to other Clean Water Act programs. These programs would subject county governments to increasingly complex and costly federal regulatory requirements under the proposed rule which impacts local stormwater and pesticide application programs, state water quality standards designations, green infrastructure and water reuse.

Additionally, key terms used in the proposed regulation—tributary, adjacent waters, riparian areas, flood plains, and even ditch exemptions on uplands and flow—are unclear. It is uncertain how these definitions will be used to effectively implement various CWA programs.

More importantly, the agencies’ cost-benefits analysis—*Economic Analysis of Proposed Revised Definition of Waters of the U.S.* (March 2013), acknowledges the data used and assumptions made to craft the analysis may be flawed. This is of supreme concern to local governments who may serve as both the regulator and the regulated under CWA. If costs and implications of the changes are not recognized ahead of time, it will have a negative impact on local governments.

Public Works Director Avis Whitfield is scheduled to retire June 30, 2015 after thirty-nine (39) years of service to Santa Rosa County. He is an extremely capable Public Works Director and a valued member of my senior staff.

I have given the matter of his replacement a great deal of thought over the past year or so and it has become clear to me that Santa Rosa County is probably the last county of its size and complexity that does not require a professionally licensed engineer as its public works director. Avis has been that capable, but he has also had an assistant public works director for the past nine (9) years that is a professional engineer.

Stephen Furman is beginning his twentieth year of service in Santa Rosa County, serving as the Assistant Public Works Director since September, 2005. He began his service in November 1995 beginning as Project Engineer and later as Assistant County Engineer.

Given the above, I recommend promoting Stephen Furman to the position of Public Works Director effective July 1, 2015. He has the professional credentials, institutional knowledge, and the respect of rank and file public works employees and his peers throughout the county. To that end, find proposed employment services contract for Public Works Director effective July 1, 2015 at starting salary of \$111,404.80.

This approval will allow Human Resources Department to proceed with advertising the Assistant Public Works Director position which will be vacated by Stephen Furman. The goal is to have that position filled in mid to late January which will allow a transition period for the Assistant and for Stephen Furman which is strongly recommended by Avis Whitfield and was a strategy that worked extremely well in transitioning the OMB Director position several years ago.

PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT

**STATE OF FLORIDA
COUNTY OF SANTA ROSA**

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into by and between Santa Rosa County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, hereinafter called "COUNTY", and Stephen L. Furman, hereinafter called "DIRECTOR",

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, COUNTY desires to employ the services of DIRECTOR as Public Works Director of Santa Rosa County, Florida, and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of COUNTY to provide certain benefits, establish certain conditions of employment, and to set working conditions of said COUNTY as an inducement and consideration for DIRECTOR entering this contract, and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of DIRECTOR to accept employment as Public Works Director of said County.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained, the parties agree as follows:

1. **DUTIES.** COUNTY hereby confirms its appointment of DIRECTOR and DIRECTOR hereby confirms his acceptance of such appointment, to be Public Works Director of Santa Rosa County. DIRECTOR duties shall include such other duties as directed by the County Administrator.

2. **PERFORMANCE OF DUTIES.** All acts performed by the DIRECTOR explicitly or impliedly on behalf of COUNTY shall be deemed authorized by the COUNTY as its agent; except that any act which constitutes willful misconduct or which may be unlawful, contrary to any directive, written or oral, of the Board of County Commissioners or contrary to any policy of the Board of County Commissioners, shall be deemed to be the individual act of the DIRECTOR and without authority of the COUNTY.

3. **OFFICE SPACE AND SECRETARIAL STAFF.** COUNTY shall furnish DIRECTOR adequate office space, office supplies, office equipment and secretarial assistance.

4. **FULL-TIME OCCUPATION.** The parties expect that PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR will devote substantially his full working time to the performance of the duties required hereunder. To this end, DIRECTOR shall not engage in any gainful employment or

consequential income producing activities which will in any way conflict with, or impair his ability to satisfactorily discharge and perform all responsibilities and duties required hereunder.

Nothing herein shall prohibit DIRECTOR from taking reasonable periods of leave commensurate with reasonable personal, sickness and vacation leave; provided, however, that DIRECTOR shall remain responsible for proper discharge of his duties through the County's employees under his supervision.

DIRECTOR shall be permitted to engage in outside consulting work, provided he gives notice of intent to do so to the County Administrator and he uses his annual or other accrued leave for this purpose.

5. **DUTIES PERSONAL AND NOT ASSIGNABLE.** The duties required to be performed hereunder by DIRECTOR and all rights and obligations under this Agreement in favor of DIRECTOR are personal and shall not be assignable.

6. **TERMINATION.** This agreement may be terminated by either party without cause upon giving ninety (90) days written notice. The COUNTY may terminate DIRECTOR with less than ninety (90) days notice if COUNTY pays a lump sum cash amount equal to DIRECTOR's salary for the period of time that notice of termination is less than ninety (90) days.

The lump sum cash payment provided for in this section shall be DIRECTOR's exclusive remedy for any breach of this contract by COUNTY. DIRECTOR hereby agrees that the lump sum payment so provided shall serve as liquidated damages for any violation or breach of this contract by COUNTY, and DIRECTOR acknowledges he shall not be entitled to any other lump sum payments other than his accrued leave.

In the event DIRECTOR voluntarily terminates this Agreement with COUNTY, then DIRECTOR shall give COUNTY ninety (90) days advance written notice, unless mutually agreed otherwise. In the event of such voluntary termination, DIRECTOR shall be entitled to be paid in full for accumulated annual leave.

7. **COMPENSATION.** COUNTY agrees to compensate DIRECTOR for his services rendered pursuant hereto at the rate of \$111,404.80 per annum, payable biweekly in accordance with pay periods for County employees. DIRECTOR's base compensation shall be adjusted annually to reflect the same percentages of merit and cost-of-living increases as the Board of County Commissioners may approve for County employees based upon performance evaluation conducted by the County Administrator. Director's merit increase shall be equivalent to the merit increases received by a classified employee starting at Step 4.

In addition, COUNTY shall pay Employer's F.I.C.A. and any statutorily required employer contributions to the Florida State Retirement System, and shall withhold required federal income taxes. DIRECTOR shall further receive all rights, fringe benefits, privileges and coverage otherwise afforded to classified County employees. DIRECTOR shall accrue annual and sick leave at the same rate as other classified County employees. At the termination of this Agreement, shall be paid for unused leave in the same manner as classified employees.

8. **INSURANCE.** DIRECTOR shall be included in COUNTY's group insurance benefit programs, including full right to participation therein both as to himself and his dependents. COUNTY shall pay, on behalf of DIRECTOR the same portion of group insurance benefits as paid for County employees.

9. **TRAVEL ALLOWANCE.** County shall provide a COUNTY vehicle for his use.

10 **DUES AND SUBSCRIPTIONS.** COUNTY agrees to budget and to pay the dues and subscriptions of DIRECTOR necessary for full participation in national, regional, state, and local association and organizations necessary and desirable for the good of the COUNTY.

11. **PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT.** COUNTY hereby agrees to budget and to pay the travel and subsistence of DIRECTOR for professional and official travel in such amounts as are authorized by law.

12. **FILES AND RECORDS.** All files and records concerning COUNTY business in the office of DIRECTOR or in his possession shall belong to and remain the property of COUNTY. However, Director shall have the right during the term of this Agreement and thereafter to examine and copy all records prepared by him.

13. **TERM.** This Agreement shall take effect on July 1, 2015. This Agreement may be terminated at any time by either party, subject to the provision of Paragraph 6.

The Agreement may also be modified or amended as may be mutually agreed upon by the parties. Modifications or amendments to this Agreement shall be in writing and executed by the parties.

14. **INDEMNIFICATION.** The COUNTY shall defend, save harmless and indemnify the DIRECTOR against any actions, in tort or if he is named as a party defendant in any action for any injury or damage suffered as a result of any act, event, or omission of action in the scope of his duties or function, unless he acted in bad faith or with malicious intent purpose or in a manner exhibiting wanton and willful disregard of human rights, safety, or property. The COUNTY shall not be liable in tort for the acts or omissions of the DIRECTOR committed while

THIS FIRST AMENDMENT TO DEP AGREEMENT NO. T1204 (“First Amendment”) affects the Bagdad Mill Trail Project and is made and entered into between the STATE OF FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION (the “DEPARTMENT”) and SANTA ROSA COUNTY (the “GRANTEE”).

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, on or about December 28th, 2012, the Department and Grantee entered into a Florida Recreational Trails Program Project Agreement No. T12004 (the “Agreement”) for the recreational trail project known as the Bagdad Mill Trail Project ("Project"); which Agreement is incorporated in this First Amendment by reference.

WHEREAS, the Agreement collectively includes Attachments A, B, C, D, and E.

WHEREAS, Grantee has requested an extension of time to complete the Project and to revise the Agreement’s Attachment A, Recreational Trails Program Project Grant Work Plan (hereinafter, “Attachment A”).

WHEREAS, the Department and the Grantee have confirmed that such revisions are within the parameters of the Agreement.

WHEREAS, Paragraph 3 of the Agreement also requires that revisions to Attachment A be reduced to writing in an amendment to the Agreement.

WHEREAS, the Department is willing to revise the Agreement, all as more particularly set forth in this First Amendment.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing Recitals, the Agreement, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties mutually agree as follows:

1. Recitals. The Recitals set forth hereinabove are true and correct and are incorporated herein by reference.
2. Amendments to the Agreement. The Agreement is hereby revised and/or modified as follows:

a.) The First sentence in Paragraph 1, on Page 1, is hereby deleted in its entirety, and the following is hereby substituted in lieu thereof: "The Project Agreement shall be effective upon execution of this project Agreement and end on December 28, 2015."

b.) Attachment A is hereby deleted in its entirety, and the Attachment A annexed to this First Amendment, entitled "Recreational Trails Program Project Work Plan" (Revised 10/17/14), is hereby substituted in lieu thereof. From and after the date of this First Amendment, the phrase "Attachment A" shall mean the Attachment A annexed to this First Amendment.

c.) Paragraph 7 on Page 3 is hereby deleted in its entirety, and the following is hereby substituted in lieu thereof: "The Grantee shall complete all Project construction no later than December 28, 2015."

d.) The third sentence of Paragraph 10 G. on Page 6 is hereby modified to delete the date of "February 15, 2015," and to require in lieu thereof, that Grantee must submit a final payment request to the Department no later than 45 days from the completion of the Project.

e.) Paragraphs 25 and 39 are hereby revised to update the name and address of the Department's Grant Manager, for the purpose of the Agreement, to: Robin Birdsong (or her successor), Recreational Trails Program, Office of Operations, State of Florida Department of Environmental Protection, 3900 Commonwealth Boulevard, MS 585, Tallahassee, FL 32399-3000.

3. Ratification. Except as modified by this First Amendment and its Attachment A, the Agreement is hereby ratified and confirmed and remains in full force and effect. In the event of a conflict between the Agreement and this First Amendment, this First Amendment shall control.

Situation:

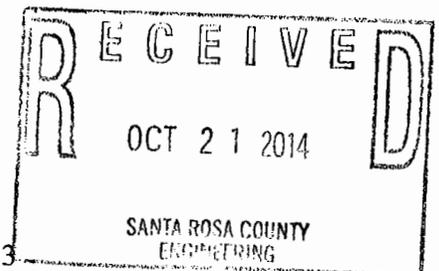
Florida Administrative Code Chapter 62-701, Solid Waste Management Facilities and Central Landfill's Operations Permit requires an estimate of the remaining disposal volume, in cubic yards, and life of the Class I Landfill be submitted to FDEP annually. The estimate must include the active Class 1 disposal area as well as any permitted areas not yet constructed.

Finding:

The Environmental Department has utilized SCS Engineers for several years to conduct an aerial topographic survey and perform the required calculations to determine remaining life and disposal capacity. Determination of the remaining life and disposal capacity requires the comparison of the new aerial survey with survey data from preceding years. SCS Engineers has retained each year's aerial topographic survey and is able to provide the service at a reasonable cost.

Recommendation:

That the Board of County Commissions approve a Task Order to SCS Engineers in the amount of \$13,500 to provide an aerial topographic survey and calculate the remaining disposal capacity for Central Landfill for submission to the Florida Department of Environmental Protection.
