MEMORANDUM

TO: Board of Commissioners

SUBJECT: Local Option Sales Tax

DISCUSSION

The Board discuss and determine the desired ballot language for a Local Option Sales Tax.

BACKGROUND

If the Board desires to have a referendum on the August ballot, the Board would need to make a final determination on the ballot language by the May 26th meeting in order to provide the language to the Supervisor of Elections no later than June 1st. A public hearing on the ordinance would also need to be established, but it would not be necessary to complete the ordinance prior to June 1st. For a tax to take effect on January 1st, the State requires notice of a referendum prior to October 1st of the preceding year.

As previously discussed the 1 cent tax would generate an estimated \$15,697,477.00 annually, with the following distribution breakdown:

County - \$14,216,316
Milton - \$887,637
Gulf Breeze - \$553,262
Jay - \$50,262

The Board is well aware that in addition to the courthouse, there are other capital needs which include: community access and connector roads (new roads), bridges, public safety vehicles, public safety communication, storm water mitigation and water quality improvements, capital grant match requirements, sidewalks/multi-purpose/bike paths, and capital recreational enhancements.

Attached you will find pertinent backup information to facilitate this discussion which includes: example ballot language, example options for tax division as well as duration, examples of capital project lists and a sample of the Escambia report card of expenditures.

Local Option Sales Tax Referendum History

Local Option Sales Tax Referendum History

September 1, 1992- one-cent sales tax to be levied to finance the construction of and property acquisition for a U.S. Department of Defense Finance and Accounting Service Center and necessary infrastructure. The tax will be levied only for the period necessary to pay off said financing, not to exceed 15 years. If Santa Rosa County is not selected as the site for the center, the sales tax shall not take effect.

Passed **Yes – 9,749** **No – 9,470**

June 29, 1993- one-cent sales tax to finance property acquisition and construction of jail

Passed **Yes – 6,355** **No – 4,165**

March 12, 1996- Approving completion of county jail/sheriff office. Limiting sales tax collection to 5 total years

Passed **Yes – 8,663** **No – 3,117**

November 5, 2002- one-cent sales tax to be levied to fund the construction of a new courthouse, renovation of the existing courthouse, and expansion of the South End Annex. The tax is to be levied for a period of 4 years

Failed **Yes – 10,833** **No – 31,906**

September 5, 2006- one-cent sales tax to be levied for 10 years to finance the following: To be used only for transportation improvements including maintenance/safety projects, roadway capacity projects, sidewalks, and bike paths

Failed **Yes – 12,097** **No – 13,178**

November 4, 2014- one-cent sales tax to be levied to fund the construction of a new courthouse at a location to be determined by referendum. The tax will be levied for a period of 5 years

Failed **Yes – 12,802** **No – 17,468**

ORDINANCE NO. 2014 - 17

AN ORDINANCE OF SANTA ROSA COUNTY, FLORIDA, IMPOSING A LOCAL GOVERNMENT INFRASTRUCTURE SALES SURTAX IN SANTA ROSA COUNTY FOR CONSTRUCTION OF A COURTHOUSE; PROVIDING FOR APPROVAL OF THE LEVY BY VOTERS IN A REFERENDUM; PROVIDING FOR THE TIME LENGTH OF IMPOSITION; PROVIDING FOR DISTRIBUTION; PROVIDING BALLOT LANGUAGE; PROVIDING A GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF THE PROJECTS TO BE FUNDED BY THE SURTAX; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Section 212.055, Florida Statutes, (the local sales tax law) authorizes Santa Rosa County to impose a one percent (1%) local option infrastructure sales surtax upon taxable transactions occurring within Santa Rosa County, as provided in Section 212.054; and

WHEREAS, a brief description of the project to be funded from the revenue is set forth in the language contained in this ordinance, as well as the ballot language; and

WHEREAS, the revenues of the local sales tax shall be distributed in accordance with Florida Statute 218.62.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SANTA ROSA COUNTY, FLORIDA, THAT:

SECTION 1. IMPOSITION OF LOCAL SALES TAX. Pursuant to the authorization granted by the local sales tax law and other applicable laws, there is hereby imposed a one percent (1%) local sales tax upon taxable transactions occurring within Santa Rosa County.

SECTION 2. SPECIAL REFERENDUM ELECTION. The local sales tax imposed in Section 1 of this Ordinance shall not take effect unless and until the local sales tax is approved by a majority of the electors of Santa Rosa County voting in a referendum election on the local sales tax held as required by this Ordinance. Said local sales tax shall take effect the first day of January, 2015.

SECTION 3. LENGTH OF IMPOSITION OF LOCAL SALES TAX. The local sales tax imposed hereby shall be effective for five (5) years from the date of levy.

SECTION 4. DISTRIBUTION OF REVENUES OF THE LOCAL SALES TAX. In accordance with the local sales tax law, revenues of the local sales tax hereby imposed shall be distributed in accordance with F.S. 218.62.

SECTION 5. HOLDING ELECTION. The Supervisor of Elections of Santa Rosa County is hereby directed to place the referendum election required by this Ordinance on the general election to be held on November 4, 2014.

SECTION 6. BALLOT QUESTION. The Supervisor of Elections of Santa Rosa County shall cause the following question to be placed on the ballot of the referendum held as required by this Ordinance:

SALES TAX FOR COURTHOUSE

"Shall a one-cent sales tax be levied to fund the construction of a new Courthouse at a location to be determined by referendum? The tax will be levied for a period of five (5) years."

SECTION 7. USE OF REVENUES. The proceeds shall be used for the items identified above.

SECTION 8. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, it is the intent of the Board that such invalidity shall not affect other provisions of this Ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application and to this end the provisions of this Ordinance are declared severable.

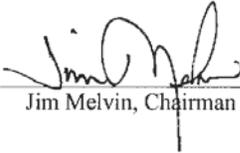
SECTION 9. CODIFICATION. The provisions of this ordinance shall become and be made a part of the code of laws and ordinances of the County of Santa Rosa. The sections of this ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such, and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section", "article", or any other appropriate word.

SECTION 10. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect upon filing of a certified copy of this Ordinance with the Department of State within ten (10) days after enactment.

Escambia Ballot Language

Statutes, the tax takes effect on January 1, 2018. This tax shall be levied and imposed in accordance with Chapter 212, Florida Statutes, and the rules of the Department of Revenue.

Section 2. Special Referendum Election. The extension of the levy of the Local Sales Tax imposed in Section 1 of this Ordinance shall not take effect unless and until the Local Sales Tax extension is approved by a majority of the electors of Escambia County voting in a special referendum election required by this Ordinance, with the results to be determined by the election results certified by the Department of State.

Section 3. Holding Special Election. The Supervisor of Elections of Escambia County is hereby directed to hold a referendum election required by this Ordinance on August 26, 2014.

Section 4. Ballot Question. The Supervisor of Elections of Escambia County shall cause the following questions to be placed on the ballot of a special referendum election held as required by this Ordinance:

**EXTENDED LEVY OF
COUNTY-WIDE ONE-CENT SALES TAX
FOR INFRASTRUCTURE / PUBLIC FACILITIES**

Shall the one-cent sales tax, approved by the voters of Escambia County by referendum held March 7, 2006 for eleven years, be extended from January 1, 2018, through December 31, 2028, to provide for law enforcement/fire and public safety facilities and equipment, transportation and drainage improvements, infrastructure projects/public facilities, recreation/natural resources, jail/court facilities, Growth Management Act mandates, capital equipment, community services, and economic development projects per section 212.055(2)(d)3., Florida Statutes?

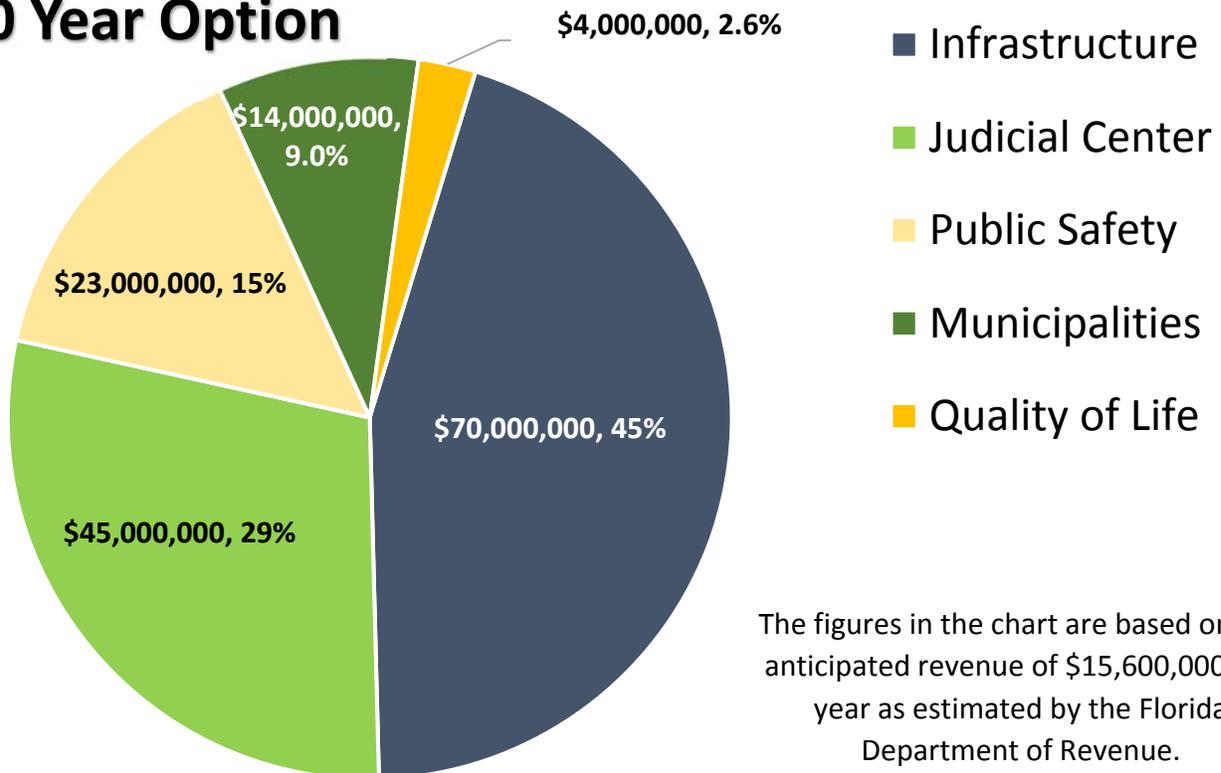

Local Option Sales Tax
1¢ for 10 years

As proposed, Option 1 will deliver the following improvements:

- 1. Infrastructure-**
 - a. Stormwater Drainage- Improve stormwater drainage to reduce chronic flooding and septic tank failure.
 - b. Sidewalk/Multiuse Paths- Increase protected pedestrian safety features to connect communities to schools and commercial amenities.
- 2. Judicial Center-**
 - a. Sales tax revenue allocated to this project will not exceed \$45 million.
- 3. Public Safety-**
 - a. Sheriff’s Deputy Patrol Cars- Currently, property taxes fund car replacement.
 - b. 911 Radio Communications- The previous system is obsolete.
- 4. Municipalities-** Per Florida Statute, a portion must be shared with municipalities based on population.
 - a. Town of Jay
 - b. City of Milton
 - c. City of Gulf Breeze
- 5. Quality of Life-**
 - a. ADA Compliance- Bring Santa Rosa County parks into compliance with current ADA requirements.

TRANSPORTATION & DRAINAGE

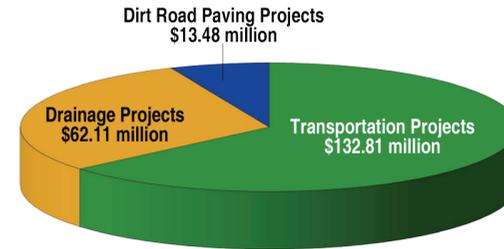
