The Board of County Commissioners of Santa Rosa County, Florida, met in Regular Session on the above date with the following members present: Chairman Lane Lynchard, Don Salter, Jayer Williamson, Rob Williamson and Robert "Bob" Cole. Also present were the Public Works Director (Steven Furman), Clerk of Court (Donald C. Spencer), Administrative Assistant/Office Manager (Emily Spencer), County Administrator (Tony Gomillion), County Attorney (Roy Andrews), County Engineer (Roger Blaylock) and Budget Director (Jayne Bell). Lynchard called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. The meeting was opened in prayer by Pastor Dustin Lambert, Calvary Baptist Church. Those present joined in the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

First on the agenda, Lynchard moved approval without objection of the minutes of the April 11, 2016 Board - LOST Workshop and the Minutes of the April 14, 2016 Regular Meeting.

Next, Lynchard moved approval without objection of the agenda.

Next on the agenda, Lynchard moved approval without objection of a proclamation proclaiming, Thursday, May 5, 2016 as National Day of Prayer in Santa Rosa County (Attachment in file).

Pastor William Wright of Bible Way Baptist Church accepted the proclamation. He said the National Day of Prayer will be observed at 12:00 p.m., May 5, 2016, on the courthouse lawn.

Economic Development Committee - J. Williamson & Lynchard

- 1) **Navarre Beach Independence Day Fireworks funding 2016**
Recommend approval to fund the 2016 Navarre Beach Independence Day Fireworks Display in the amount of \$13,800. J. Williamson moved approval without objection.
- 2) **Special Event Application - Pink Pirate's Annual PinktoberFest**
Recommend approval of the special event permit from the Pink Pirate's of Navarre to host the annual PinktoberFest on October 8, 2016. J. Williamson moved approval without objection.
- 3) **Special Event Application for Pink Pirate's 2nd Annual 5K Run**
Recommend approval of the special event permit from the Pink Pirates of Navarre to host the 2nd Annual Pink Pirates 5K Run on October 15, 2016. J. Williamson moved approval without objection.

Administrative Committee - Lynchard & J. Williamson

- 1) **Emerald Coast Utilities Authority**
Recommend agreement with the Emerald Coast Utilities Authority for the acceptance and processing of source separated recyclables. Lynchard moved approval without objection.

R. Williamson said he is going to support the interlocal agreement but would like to request that the Board direct staff to provide cost estimates for what it would take for Santa Rosa County to stand-up its own recycling facility. Lynchard said the Board did this, 4-5 years ago, and the Board can ask staff to update the numbers from the prior effort.

- 2) **Civil Service Board Vacancy**
Recommend appointment of Scott Kemp to the Santa Rosa County Civil Service Board effective June 1, 2016 and approval for Chairman to send a letter of appreciation to Mr. Steve Ford for his years of service. Lynchard moved approval without objection.

R. Williamson said it is his pleasure to nominate Kemp for this responsibility and knows he will serve well. He thanked Kemp and Ford for their service.

3) **Camden Drive MSBU**

Recommend approval of the following actions related to Camden Drive MSBU:

1. The parcels denoted as the Holley By The Sea Improvement Association, Inc. or Holley By The Sea Improvement Association as Trustee shall not be included in the consideration and assessment for citizen initiatives for MSBU funded improvements.
2. That the MSBU request for a section of Camden Drive between Hartland Street and Castlewood Street be included in the tentative rate resolution hearing scheduled for May 12, 2016.

Lynchard moved approval without objection.

4) **Magistrate Selection**

Recommend agreements with Mr. Gregory P. Farrar and Mr. Larry A. Mathews for Magistrate Services. Lynchard moved approval without objection.

R. Williamson asked about the rate of \$125. Andrews said that is the agreed rate from both applicants and the proposed contracts are in the backup.

5) **Guidelines for Public Presentations to the Board**

Recommend amended guidelines related to public requested agenda items and public meeting participation. Lynchard moved approval without objection.

6) **NACo (National Association of Counties) Appointments** (This item was added to the agenda since Monday.)

Discussion and approval of the following actions related to NACo appointments:

1. Designate Commissioner Cole to serve as Chairman of NACo’s Environment, Energy and Land Use (EELU) Policy Steering Committee Position.
2. Designate Commissioner Cole to serve as Committee Member of NACo’s Arts & Culture Commission.

Cole said he has served on both of these committees for several years now. He said he would like to apply for the chairmanship of the entire EELU committee, which requires support of this Board.

Lynchard said the incoming president of NACo is a resident of Florida and a Leon County Commissioner. He said hopefully some of the issues that Florida is facing will be brought to the forefront through his efforts, with NACo, this coming year.

Lynchard moved approval without objection.

Lynchard moved approval without objection.

Engineer's Report

Blaylock gave the Board an update regarding of the Navarre Beach renourishment project.

1) **Maranatha HMGP Project**

Recommend approval of license agreement with Robert McClure for the Maranatha HMGP project. Lynchard moved approval without objection.

2) **Central Landfill Phase IV-Cell C**

Recommend approval of Deductive Change Order #1, which reduces the original construction contract by \$77,902.99 to the new sum of \$2,279,134.87. Lynchard moved approval without objection.

Blaylock said Change Order #1 is with Atlantis Commercial Group, Inc.

3) **Hamilton Bridge Road Sidewalks LAP Project**

Recommend staff develop right-of-way feasibility for acquisition of additional right-of-way for the Hamilton Bridge Road sidewalk LAP project. Funding up to \$10,000 from District 1 Recreation funds and \$30,000 from area 2 transportation impact fees. Lynchard moved approval without objection.

Cole discussed the Bagdad/Milton connector project. He said with the Bagdad Mill Site Park coming on-line it will be even more of a precedent to get this connector made. Cole said he would like to see if the Board would reserve \$10,000.00 - 15,000.00 of the District 2 transportation fee balance to go toward this project.

Lynchard asked Bell the balance of this account. Bell said the area two impact fees are approximately \$70,000.00. Lynchard said this will leave a balance of approximately \$36,000.00 in area two impact fees. He said the Board can talk about this as an action item on a future meeting.

4) **Plantation Woods Subdivision Phase IV Final Plat**

Recommend Final Plat for Plantation Woods Subdivision Phase IV, a 26 lot subdivision, a portion of Section 33, Township 2 North, Range 27 West, Santa Rosa County, Florida. (District 2). Lynchard moved approval without objection.

5) **Plantation Woods Subdivision Phase IV Paved Road and Drainage Maintenance**

Recommend Paved Road and Drainage Maintenance for Plantation Woods Subdivision Phase IV, a 26 lot subdivision, a portion of Section 33, Township 2 North, Range 27 West, Santa Rosa County, Florida. (District 2) Bellview Court 571 LF; Longmont Way 989 LF.

Lynchard moved approval without objection.

Public Service's Committee - Cole & R. Williamson

1) **9-1-1 Connectivity**

Recommend approval to allow staff to proceed with the purchase of equipment and license to complete the 9-1-1 Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) connectivity project at a cost of \$16,308.00 based on sole source and standardization of computers. Cole moved approval without objection.

2) **9-1-1 Recorders**

Recommend approval to allow staff to proceed with the purchase of VPI 9-1-1 recorders for the Emergency Communications Center (ECC), Sheriff's Office and Milton Police Department dispatch centers at a cost of \$73,731.00 from Replay Systems. Cole moved approval without objection.

Public Works Committee - Salter & Cole

1) **Spencer Field Drainage**

Recommend approval for Public Works to proceed with the installation of a storm drain pipe across East Spencer Field Road to eliminate the ponding of water on the sidewalk at an approximate cost of \$5,000, with funding from the Road and Bridge budget. Salter moved approval without objection.

2) **Contract Extension to the Navarre Median Landscape Project**

Recommend approval of an eight week time extension as requested by Piney Grove Nursery on the Navarre Highway 98 Median Beautification contract. The request would extend the current contract until June 30, 2016. Salter moved approval without objection.

3) **HDPE Pipe Contract Extension**

Recommend approval of the first allowable annual extension of the contract with Arcadia Culverts for HDPE pipe at current pricing. Salter moved approval without objection.

4) **Aluminized Pipe Contract Extension**

Recommend approval of the first allowable annual extension of the contract with Gulf Atlantic Culvert for aluminized pipe at current pricing. Salter moved approval without objection.

5) **Bituminous Coated Pipe Contract Extension**

Recommend approval of the first allowable annual extension of the contract with Gulf Atlantic Culverts for bituminous coated pipe at current pricing. Salter moved approval without objection.

Budget & Financial Management Committee - R. Williamson & Salter

1) Budget Amendment 2016-127

Recommend budget amendment 2016-127 in the amount of \$73,708 recognizing receipt of the first half of the BP Supplemental Promotional Fund Grant in the amount of \$36,800, approved February 1, 2016, and to carry forward funds of \$36,908 in anticipation of disbursement of the second half upon submission of all deliverables and allocate for expenditure. This is to pay invoices received from Davis, South, Barnette & Patrick for media services provided in fulfillment of grant requirements. R. Williamson moved approval without objection.

Cole asked if the Board will have a chance to discuss the list of items that were sent to the Department of Treasury, once the list is returned. Lynchard said once this comes back from Treasury, the items on the MYIP (Multi Year Implementation Plan) will each be subject to individual grant applications, to receive funding. Cole said he thought he made it clear that he was not in favor of a couple of the items and was wondering if and when the Board will have this opportunity again. Lynchard said the Board will approve each individual application as it is submitted to Treasury. He said the Board will have to amend the MYIP if items are going to drop off.

Gomillion said there is updated information relative to some complicated process that is going on. He said the Grants Department has found out some significant new information within the last couple of weeks. Gomillion said the MYIP has not been submitted to Treasury at this point. He said staff will bring this item back to the Board to discuss further, most likely at the next meeting.

Lynchard said he thought that the MYIP had already been submitted. R. Williamson said that was his understanding as well. Gomillion said the Board took action and approved the submittal. He said there are a few "snags" that need to be worked out that he became aware of this week and staff is working toward having these answers/decisions that need to be brought back.

Lynchard said this will be brought back at the first meeting in May. Gomillion said he hopes to have this back for discussion then.

There was further discussion.

Salter said this Board approved the Restore Councils list. R. Williamson said this is the initial MYIP related to the Transocean settlement. He said there will be another MYIP that will be submitted for the remainder of the BP fine money that is coming into the direct component. R. Williamson said the Board approved the MYIP, but he understands that the Board can remove items from that list. He said ultimately, the Board will have the opportunity to review every one of the items again, as they go through the individual grant process, before the final decision is made to move forward. R. Williamson said Salter is correct that the MYIP and the projects listed on it have been approved by this Board.

2) Budget Amendment 2016-128

Recommend budget amendment 2016-128 in the amount of \$155,625 to recognize FEMA HMGP Grant revenue and required match for Phase I design of storm-water and drainage improvements for the recently approved Venetian Way / Coronado Drive HMGP project. Grant funds 75% of anticipated engineering, permitting, survey fees, and Phase I grant administration (\$207,500) with local match coming from Electric Franchise Fee Drainage Reserves. R. Williamson moved approval without objection.

3) Budget Amendment 2016-129

Recommend budget amendment 2016-129 in the amount of \$20,000 to supplement the Bagdad Mill Site landscaping budget as well as provide additional funds for miscellaneous park needs that may be identified prior to the park opening as approved at the March 10, 2016 meeting. R. Williamson moved approval without objection.

4) Budget Amendment 2016-130

Recommend budget amendment 2016-130 in the amount of \$16,308 to carry forward and allocate for expenditure funds to purchase licenses and computers to complete the 911 computer aided dispatch (CAD) connectivity project. R. Williamson moved approval without objection.

5) Budget Amendment 2016-131

Recommend budget amendment 2016-131 in the amount of \$73,731 to carry forward and allocate for

expenditure funds to purchase VPI 911 recorders for the SRC Emergency Communications Center, Sheriff's office, and Milton Police department to include support for years 2 & 3. R. Williamson moved approval without objection.

6) **Budget Amendment 2016-132**

Recommend budget amendment 2016-132 in the amount of \$310,016 recognizing FY 2014 Homeland Security funds awarded and allocate for expenditure. R. Williamson moved approval without objection.

7) **Budget Amendment 2016-133**

Recommend Budget Amendment 2016 - 133 in the amount of \$7,782 to transfer recreation funds from District IV and District V reserves (\$3,891 each) to the Parks Department for six (6) memorial benches and plaques as requested from Leadership Santa Rosa Class 29 for the Navarre Black Hawk Memorial. R. Williamson moved approval without objection.

8) **Check Register**

Recommend the County Check Register. R. Williamson moved approval without objection.

Project/Applicant: Holley-Navarre Water System, Inc., Paul Gardner

Zoned: R1 (Single Family Residential)
Request: Conditional Use to allow a private utility, specifically a RIB system (Rapid Infiltration Basin), to be located within an R1 zoning district LDC 6.09.02.J)
District: Commissioner District #4
Zoning Board
Recommendation: *Approved with a vote of 4 – 2: Richardson & Hawkins opposed the motion*

Gardner (General Manager, Holley Navarre Water System) read a prepared statement to the Board regarding the history of this property and the reason for this request (Attachment in file).

Cole asked Gardner if there is there is engineering quantifying a statement he made regarding the creek level not rising more than 1/16th of an inch. Dale Long (Municipal Engineering Services) said the 1/16th of the inch was based on an environmental assessment that was done in 2005. He said this environmental assessment provided some standard cross section for Williams Creek. He further discussed the base flow of Williams Creek and his calculation of the change in depth.

Cole asked about the assurance of no untreated waste getting into this system. Phil Phillips (Municipal Engineering Services) said Holley Navarre Water System (HNWS) has to maintain reject storage at the wastewater treatment plant. He said currently HNWS has 3 million gallons of reject capacity, so when the plant is upset, it does not go anywhere but into the reject ponds. He said it is then recirculated into the plant for treatment. Phillips further discussed in detail, the required four constituents for wastewater treatment. Cole asked if there is a time lapse on monitoring wells and if they are independently monitored. Phillips said the wells are continuously monitored by the water system. He said there is an independent testing lab that pull these tests and report the tests to DEP (Department of Environmental Protection) on a quarterly basis.

Kelli Swim said she lives on Williams Creek Drive. She said 19 out of 21 residents of the neighborhood have signed a petition in opposition of the RIB system because of the unknown effects it could have. Swim said there are no guarantees that this system will not malfunction.

She said the residents are concerned with the unknown. Swim said this neighborhood already floods. She further discussed a copy of the environmental assessment report for the proposed Santa Rosa County RIB system at Eglin. Swim said this report clearly describes Williams Creek as a non-viable option for a RIB system. She handed the Board pictures displaying the flooding of the neighborhood.

R. Williamson asked to see a copy of the study that Swim referenced. Swim gave R. Williamson a copy of the study.

Jeff Hinson said he has lived in Williams Creek since 1991. He said he disagrees that this RIB is well placed near Williams Creek. Hinson discussed a water run-off problem that was caused when a school was built nearby on raised land. He said there is a plan, three years from now, to put a RIB system in an unpopulated area on the Eglin reservation.

Cole asked if the entire Williams Creek neighborhood is provided with sewage. Hinson said yes.

Patricia Hinson said the flooding is horrendous. She said she has the highest, driest lot in the neighborhood and it floods every time there is a moderate amount of rain. Hinson said her concerns are with the environment.

Connie Campbell said her property back up to Williams Creek. She handed the Board a report done for Santa Rosa County in 2006. Campbell said the report addresses the Williams Creek site as an unlikely candidate for a RIB system. She said the report states that new domestic wastewater discharges, to class 2 waters, are prohibited by FDEP. Campbell said the RIB system is a great idea on Eglin Air Force Base, where it is proposed. She said she feels elected officials have a due diligence and responsibility to do what is right.

Leah Roberts discussed her concerns and opposition with the proposed RIB system in this area.

Linda Young said she lives in the neighborhood adjacent to Williams Creek. She said she is the Executive Director of the Florida Clean Water Network. Young discussed her concerns with Holley Navarre Water System's permit.

Wallis Mahute said Santa Rosa County's waterways are at stake and the county needs these for tourism. She said she hopes the Board considers the pleas of the public on this issue. Mahute asked the Board not to create another Holley By The Sea situation.

Jeff Roberts said he owns property on Promise Creek. He said Promise Creek is between 100-150 lots that were developed after the study in 2005. Roberts said he does not see how the Board could approve this variance, based off of the lack of information and the lack of a current study.

James Calkins said he lives near Williams Creek and believes this is extremely important for the area. He said the HNWS is currently at capacity and the RIB system is needed to relieve this capacity, until it is put at Eglin. Calkins said he is in support of this request.

Mende Naylor said she received approximately 25 signatures of residents, near Williams Creek, that are in opposition of this request. She handed the Board the petition. Naylor said she hopes the Board will reject this project, at least, until there is updated information.

Gailes Bruce said he feels the county needs to what it can to get as many people on sewer. He said the residents need this permit. Bruce said in most cases, the RIB will help move water through the system and away from Williams Creek.

Salter said the concept of reuse water is to take the pressure off of potable water. He said he supports the project based on the concept that there is a DEP permit in place to ensure compliance.

R. Williamson said he does not see that this is a long-term solution. He said he was inclined to ask that this request be tabled until the following month. R. Williamson said he would like to explore some of the solutions mentioned. He said Eglin would provide enough growth and give the capacity needed. R. Williamson said there are other opportunities that could be used and the long-term solution is partnering with Santa Rosa County to bring the project on-line at Eglin. He said he does not have enough information tonight to vote in favor of this. R. Williamson said he recommends tabling this until next month.

J. Williamson said he would support tabling this issue until next month, as well. He said his concerns are with the report being from 2004 and the growth that has happened in the county since then.

Cole said he also supports tabling this request. He said he has heard a lot of concern tonight about the flooding problems that already exist that has nothing to do with this filtration basin.

Lynchard said he has concerns as well and is a little disappointed that the most recent environmental assessment was in 2004. He said he would have to have a lot more information to approve this.

Cole asked the Board if there is a will to direct staff and the county administrator to bring the date up to speed and get a report back to update this Board and the public maybe within the next 30 days. Lynchard said he thinks the sticking point with that has been money.

R. Williamson asked Gardner if this was granted, how much time would this buy HNWS as it relates to the cap. Gardner said if we can get the I&I down and the Greskovick property, we are hoping that will give just enough time to get to Eglin. R. Williamson asked if he was anticipating that if you were to get the ability to put out an additional 250,000 gallons a day that would buy you 3 years at the current growth rate. Phillips said yes. R. Williamson said he would love to have the additional month to get some of the questions answered, maybe provide a way forward and look at some additional solutions if any exist to buy more time instead of this option in front of the Board now.

J. Williamson said if this conditional use was granted, what would be a time process of getting this system online. Gardner said approximately 8 months.

R. Williamson moved approval without objection to table this item until the May 26, 2016 meeting at 6 p.m.

Cole said he has concerns in changing this property from Agriculture to M1. He said the Future Land Use for this property is Agriculture and once the property is changed in zoning, it continues with the property. Cole said he has heard from several of the neighbors in this area and they feel discouraged that the Board is even considering this change. He said he cannot support this type of intrusive change to the property.

Esser said she wants to run this business in Santa Rosa County. She said this property is within less than a half mile to the interstate. Esser further discussed her plans for this property.

J. Williamson said he would have no issue with supporting this request noticing the other types of businesses in this area.

R. Williamson said staff noted that industrial uses would not be compatible with the existing uses within the vicinity. He said there are approximately 2200 acres of vacant land, zoned industrial in the East Milton area. R. Williamson said he supports Cole's recommendation.

Salter said he supports Cole's recommendation. He said he does not think the request is compatible.

Cole moved to deny this request without objection.

Cato said she like to know the Boards thoughts regarding the 60 days versus 30 days for the review of new policies, procedures, and regulations. R. Williamson said 30 days.

R. Williamson asked David Peaden of the Home Builders Association of West Florida, if the state of the housing report will be regional or is it currently done in Escambia County, looking to add Santa Rosa County. Peaden said Rob Hale from Market Graphic Southeast does a focused approach for the two-county area. He said he feels Hale should be brought back before the Board to discuss the past year and future evaluation of the market.

Salter asked Peaden if 30 days “doable”. Peaden said yes.

After further discussion, Lynchard said the consensus of the Board is that 30 days is sufficient.
