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Santa Rosa County Seeks Input for Second Phase of Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan

Santa Rosa County is again asking residents to participate in the second phase of a bicycle pedestrian master plan for south Santa Rosa. Working together, staff and citizens are developing a plan for safe transportation alternatives with the goal of making south Santa Rosa more bicycle and pedestrian friendly as an alternative to travel on U.S. Highway 98. Once complete, the plan will help guide future projects with an emphasis on increasing the overall quality of life for residents by focusing on improving safety, recreational and tourism opportunities in the south end.

Residents are invited to participate by attending one of three public focus group meetings in February:

- Friday, Feb. 13 from 11:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. in Classroom B of the Andrews Research and Education Institute, 1020 Gulf Breeze Pkwy. in Gulf Breeze
- Tuesday, Feb. 17 from 11:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the Tiger Point Community Center, 1370 Tiger Park Ln. in Gulf Breeze
- Tuesday, Feb. 17 from 5 to 6:30 p.m. at the Navarre Visitor Information Center, 8543 Navarre Pkwy. in Navarre

The master planning process will be completed by mid-May and includes collecting resident input, analyzing existing facilities, researching potential connections developing a bicycle loop and/or a pedestrian grid, and identifying potential funding sources.
